We are celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Lunar Landing on July 20, 1969. When Neil Armstrong uttered those famous words that were heard by over a half billion people on live television. Many nations in Europe had it on big screen TVs in their plazas. The world was eager. Yes, they wanted us to meet the JFK pledge of beating the Russians to the moon.

This was a tumultuous time with riots in our streets during this period with assassinations and peace marches disrupting our lives and making many people doubt ourselves as a nation.

For those with doubts, there was a very good three part series on Science TV called "Truth Behind the Lunar Landing". They had an astronaut who worked 24 years for NASA, a former FBI agent, and a conspiracy theorist, who had been a former aero-space tech. These three went to independent science labs around the country debunking theory after theory.

Now we have some people complaining that it was an American flag put on the moon. Well, too bad. It was our blood, sweat and tears and we even lost astronauts in training. In their honor there was no reason not to celebrate this as a truly American event. _

Exemptions For Property Tax

As many as 26,500 senior citizens could save a total of \$45 million on their Cook County property tax bills due Aug. 1st, by applying for exemptions they received last year according to Cook County Treasurer Maria Pappas.

Those homeowners received the Senior Citizen Homestead last year but have not reapplied. Of those seniors, roughly 19,200 received the Senior Freeze Exemption last year but also have not reapplied.

To verify tax exemptions going back four years, visit cookcountytreasurer.com and: Select the purple box labeled "Your Property Tax Overview". Enter your address or Property Index Number (PIN). Check the results under "Have You Received Your Exemptions in 'These Tax Years?'" If you believe you are entitled to an exemption, which are available to homeowners who are 65 years of age or older. The Senior Freeze, which prevents increases in the taxable value of a home, is limited to seniors with annual household incomes of \$65,000 or less.

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

ComEd Prepares For Excessive Heat

With forecasts for the longest stretch of consecutive days in the upper 90s since 2012 this week, ComEd is increasing crew staffing, proactively opening its Emergency Operations Center and readying equipment to respond quickly if power outages occur.

ComEd's smart grid improvements have resulted in improved reliability for customers year-round, including during extreme weather. For example, distribution automation, or "smart switches," that reroute power around trouble spots helped avoid more than 280,000 customer interruptions for families and businesses during 2019 winter storms.

Public safety is paramount, and ComEd encourages customers to take the following precautions:

If a downed power line is spotted, immediately call ComEd at 1-800-EDISON1 (1-800-334-7661). Spanish-speaking customers should call 1-800-95-LUCES (1-800-955-8237).

Never approach a downed power line. Always assume a power line is energized and extremely dangerous.

In the event of an outage, do not approach ComEd crews working to restore power to ask about restoration times. Crews may be working on live electrical equipment and the perimeter of the work zone may be hazardous.

ComEd urges customers to contact the company immediately if they experience a power outage. Customers can text OUT to 26633 (COMED) to report an outage and receive restoration information, and can follow the company on Twitter @ComEd or on Facebook at Facebook.com/ComEd. Customers can also call 1-800-EDISON1 (1-800-334-7661), or report outages via the website at www.ComEd.com/report. Spanish-speaking customers should call 1-800-95-LUCES (1-800-955-8237).

ComEd programs incent customers to reduce energy use on days when demand is highest, such as when many people are running air conditioners at once. More than 301,000 customers are enrolled in ComEd's Peak Time Savings program, providing 36 megawatts of demand response. This year, two peak days have been called, offering those customers the opportunity to earn credits on their electric bills by reducing their power for several hours on those days. The program saved customers \$3.2 million in 2018 and a total of \$5.6 million since the program launched in summer 2015.

Higher temperatures also can lead to higher energy bills. Customers can save energy and money on hot days by following a few simple tips:

Turn it off: Turn off all unnecessary lighting and devices. Set your thermostat at as high a temperature as comfortably possible and ensure humidity control if needed. Keep shades, blinds and curtains closed. Use ceiling fans to circulate air. Run appliances that produce heat (like clothes dryers, ovens and dishwashers) at night when it is cooler.

If you don't have access air conditioning, seek relief from the heat in places like schools, libraries, theaters and malls. Check on family, friends and neighbors who do not have air conditioning or who spend much of their time alone.

Be familiar with the warning signs of heat-related illness, including dizziness, nausea, headache, rapid heartbeat, chest pain, fainting and breathing problems. If you experience any of these symptoms, you should seek help immediately.
