Students and Bereavement

With the events in Orlando, we once again come up with the problem "What do we say to the children?" Dr. David Schonfeld dealt with this subject last year in "The Leader" a magazine published by the American Federation of School Administrators. Dr. Schonfeld is director of the National Center for School Crisis and Bereavement. To say there is one answer is, of course, over-simplistic. Some children feel bad when seeing things that are thousands of miles away and others are not seemingly affected by problems down the block.



Some children we deal with have had issues close to home. I am familiar with many of these students. Many were involved in tragic ways. All people are complicated. Some of our students may have been victims or had victims in their families. How the child goes through the grieving process varies. It is a common statement that children are resilient. While this is true, some may have delayed reactions. The main issue seems to be are their adults around them that listen and try to be non-judgmental. All too often the students I have known were surrounded by people at home that were themselves in denial. Some, looking for revenge, and, therefore, the children get the implication, stated or not stated, that they are not able to be safe at home and their family cannot produce a safe environment.

There are two types of violence affecting the kids, the local neighborhood and the broader situations, like shootings in schools and in Orlando. And, of course, things like 9/11. We must, as parents and teachers, try and let the children talk about their feelings. Remember after 9/11 how good it felt to our psyche to hear and listen to President Bush and Mayor Guliani who both said things will be okay and the criminals would come to justice. These kids yesterday had to hear our leader talk about ease in getting guns. There is a huge difference there. Especially since many of these kids have parents with legal firearms at home. I even heard teenager on the radio ask if this meant his family helped cause the shooting in Orlando. Be careful what you say. Reassure these little ones you will do what you can to make them safe.

Dr. Schonfeld says students can profit from adult guidance that lets them work through their feelings and think through their feelings and help them cope and try to be reassuring. I have told this story before, but it fits here. When I was principal at St. Paul/Our Lady of Vilna we were following Archdiocese guides in emergency drills. I took these seriously and made my students do it too. One of the things was to lock the door to the classroom and hide the kids so that they couldn't be seen through the glass. Having a key, I entered the kindergarten class to see how they were doing and when they came out I asked a little girl what they were doing. She said they were learning to hide from the bad guys. She asked me what would I do if one came into their room. I told them I'd take off my shoe and beat him with it. The kids cheered and were happy and came and hugged me. I had succeeded in making them feel safe as we should all do.

Dr. Schonfeld's research shows that when found with violence in the neighborhood, sometimes the students join gangs to feel protected. Even though the gangs may be causing the violence. Please avoid watching violent episodes on the day-long news programs. They do not need to hear the talking heads give their opinions on what went wrong. I hear within hours of the Orlando incident that certain people were blaming the FBI and the gun lobby. This before they even knew the total of dead. I have seen kids crying in school because they have seen on TV people being beheaded just because they were Christian, while they, themselves, are Christian. I have met many children who have become fearful of African-Americans because of seeing the riots in Ferguson and Baltimore and, yes, UIC.


