Governor JB Pritzker signed HB 3882 into law, which grants undocumented immigrants the opportunity to obtain a standardized Driver's License. This will replace the current Temporary Visitor Driver's License with a standard 4-year license that serves as a valid form of identification and remains compliant with the federal REAL ID Act.

Individuals must still pass a driving test, have valid insurance, present identification documents, and prove Illinois residency for at least one year. HB 3882 will be effective on January 1st,

Home Health Services Law

A measure championed by State Senator Omar Aquino to increase the availability of home health services and in-home care was signed into law on June 30th. Professional licenses

for home health, home services, and home nursing agencies will be valid for 240 days may receive a renewal of a provisional license for up to 90 days while working toward full licensure, enabling them to continue offering services without disruption for patients who require in-home care.

In-home care workers provide essential services to seniors and people with disabilities so that they can live independently in their homes. Home health agencies have reported an inability to admit patients due to staffing and service shortages in recent years, with some agencies rejecting as many as 40% of new patent referrals.

Aquino's law will ensure that home health agencies who are not in operation at the time of application for licensure will be able to operate on a provisional license as long as they are making progress toward full licensure requirements.


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
