## Chesterton Academy High School

The talk about choice in schools has led me to investigate a truly unique school. I did know a parent who mentioned the G. K. Chesterton Academy, but when I retired I forgot about it until I heard them advertising on Catholic Radio.

I decided to visit the school, a great facility in Highland Park. Now the question is why write about a school not in our area. While visiting the school, I recognized some of the freshmen and sophomores. They were from Blessed Sacrament, St. Mary of Perpetual Help and St. Jerome parishes. There were students that graduated from St. Bruno, Pope John Paul II and St. Jerome. This peaked my interest. I talked to a few of these students and they told me about attending daily Mass, and taking classes that their friends in other schools could not take. This included reading and discussing the works of Plato, Aristotle, and Homer, to name a few. They made sure I knew that the school was special and that the train



station was only a block away.

If you are interested in their curriculum, their website gives a good explanation of a Classical Education. I had spent some of my career in the Catholic School System. I taught Math for six years, and was a principal for three. I really appreciate that the faculty at G. K. Chesterton Academy takes an Oath of Fidelity to the Magisterium of the Catholic Church. This helps for a consistency in theology and morals.

If you have children getting ready for high school, you take your faith seriously and want your children to experience a rigorous curriculum, this is a place to look into. They will have an Open House in early December and will be happy to answer all your questions. Though the travel is far, you may find it beneficial and the tuition is about half of many of the other Catholic high schools.

## Tree Lighting In Millennium Park

The City of Chicago is pleased to announce the lineup for the 102nd Annual Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony on Tuesday, Nov. 24th, in Millennium Park (Washington St. and Michigan Ave.). The free event begins at 5:30 p.m. The 63 foot Colorado Blue Spruce was donated by the Voelker family of Northlake, Illinois.

Headlining the ceremony is Renee Fleming, Creative Consultant at Lyric Opera of Chicago. This holiday season she will be appearing in Lyric's presentation of The Merry Widow with seven performances beginning Nov. 14th. She will perform holiday classics during the ceremony.

Soprano Danielle de Niese, appearing in Lyric Opera's world premiere of Bel Canto, will also perform at the tree lighting ceremony. Bel Canto was curated by Renée Fleming and is based on the best-selling novel of the same name by Ann Patchett.

Cast members from Emerald City Theatre's A Charlie Brown Christmas will perform songs from the stage pro-

duction.

The Latin Music Project Ensemble, part of the Puerto Rican Arts Alliance will also perform traditional holiday music. Throughout, the tree lighting ceremony will be emceed by the father/daughter duo of Bob Jordan, WGN TV Weekend Anchor, and Karen Jordan, ABC 7 Weekend Anchor and reporter.

The City's first official Christmas Tree was lit by Mayor Carter Harrison in 1913 in Grant Park at Monroe St. and Michigan Ave - two blocks from where the tree will now stand. For 52 years, from 1913 to 1965, Chicago's official Christmas Tree stood in various locations in Grant Park. In 1966, the tree was moved to Daley Plaza where it has been for the last 48 years with one exception: in 1982 the tree was moved to State St. and Wacker Dr. but returned to Daley Plaza the following year. This holiday season, the tree is moving to Millennium Park to combine with other holiday activities to create Chicago's premier "winter wonderland."

"The ice skating rink in Millennium Park, Caroling at Cloud Gate and the opening of Maggie Daley Park provide a unique site to view and enjoy the city's 102nd Christmas Tree," said Michelle T. Boone, Commissioner of the Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events. "The combined park sites offer plenty of robust seasonal programming and entertainment."

Special visits with Santa Claus begin following the Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony until 8 p.m. and on Thanksgiving Day from noon to 3 p.m. For Santa's regular visiting hours and dates visit cityofchicago.org/dease or millenniumpark.org.
