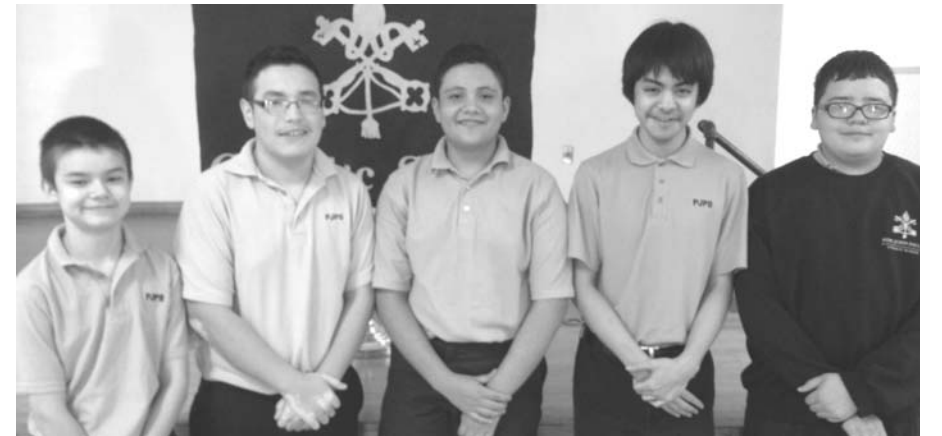

This Sunday, the city will be bristling with activities for the Chicago Marathon. This gives us numerous educational opportunities to incorporate our students and the world. The most obvious activities are mathematical and parents and teachers can make them age appropriate comparing times, the number of runners, they can determine their speed from the first to the last to cross the goal and then compare them with other athletic activities that they are familiar with in the Olympics.

Social Studies can be enhanced with the story of the ancient battles between the Greek city-states and Persians or in recent times, the tragedy at the Boston Marathon. Students can discuss extra security measures for runners in this marathon. For example, every runner is given a

clear numbered bag and a place to keep it. In Language Arts, they might write why some people run, there are the few that can earn money, but most do it for an assigned charity. My daughter is running for a charity dear to our hearts, the Organization for Autism Research -- maybe the kids know other personal stories. Just remember many studies have indicated that personalization of activities helps the learning process.

This reminds me of a true story that occurred when I was assistant principal at Nathan Davis School. That year our PE teacher was using the Olympics for his activities and one day he had the students run around our campus. When he had the 5th graders out, he had them run around the entire block. At the end of the race, one of the girls was still not in. Then some of the kids saw her coming around the final corner, dead last by a long time and distance. To her classmates' credit, three of the girls just took off to escort her the last steps in and the others cheered. When she finished with a big smile, she asked the PE teacher how many times would I have to do that to run a marathon? He responded on probably 100 times. She, good naturedly said, no wonder why that first Greek to run the marathon died after the race.
