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Wolf Pup Is Named



Over 10,000 people cast their votes to name a Mexican wolf pup born at Brookfield Zoo Chicago this spring, selecting the name Sierra among the list of four name options. The five-day-long voting contest took place on the Zoo's website from June 27th through July 2nd, offering one lucky voter a "staycation" prize package, provided by Visit Oak Park. The name is Spanish for "mountain range" and pays homage to Mexican wolves' native range near the Sierra Madre Mountains in Mexico. Guests can visit Sierra, her sister Molly, parents 5-year-old Vivilette and 11-year-old Amigo, and older brother Ahote, who was born at the Zoo in 2023, at the Regenstein Wolf Woods habitat. Sierra and Molly were part of a litter born at the Zoo on April 27th. Their seven siblings—six males and one female, were placed into wild Mexican wolf dens in New Mexico as part of the Recovery Program, Mexican wolves are the rarest subspecies, and zoos serve a vital role in the Saving Animals from Extinction program. Brookfield Zoo Chicago has participated in the recovery program since 2003.
