

Student Walk-Outs

Students in at least 40 states held walk outs in support of the Second Amendment. This includes Illinois and our own neighborhood. The event called "Stand for the Second" as reported by Jessica Schladebeck of the New York Daily News, who is one of the only journalists to cover the event, was listed by some as a pro-gun rally. The people running the event said that most were too young to own guns, it was just protecting their future rights as being constitutional.

The students reported some cases were the schools did not allow signs to be posted, or even having them taken down. But most indicated that school officials afforded them the same respect given to the people who had protested earlier against guns.

The event's website states "disruption of education has never been and will never be our goal". Out of respect for

the students in Florida, the protest asked for 16 minutes of walk out time, one less minute than the 17 that the other group was given.

The final total of participants will probably never be available, but over 500 schools signed their intent to participate. Some schools in New Mexico, California, Kansas, and Michigan had hundreds of participants. Some schools in other states had as little as a dozen.

When thinking about the event, some will quickly say it was small compared to the anti-gun rally, but there were a few grave differences.

There was no coverage, or very little, of this event by the mainstream media. I had people ask me what was going on I saw groups of kids walking along the sidewalk. I told them and they said they had never heard of it. Possibly the biggest difference is that none of these demonstrators were paid to be there and none of them got free airline travel to arrive at protest destinations. This has been well documented to be true in the other case. Probably the best thing seems to be that many of our students are learning to stand up for what they feel is right even if it is not what the mainstream media wants them to think.

Colleen Schrantz, principal of St. Bruno Catholic School, 4839 S. Harding and three teachers: Mrs. Margarita (pre K-4), Miss Kristen Person (1st grade) and Miss Jacklyn Manzi (4th grade) are enrolled in a new course on differentiated instruction at the Harvard Graduate School of Education.

The workshop model helps develop a personalized instruction that assists students to learn more effectively.
