Students in at least 40 states held walk outs in support of the Second Amendment. This includes Illinois and our own neighborhood. The event called "Stand for the Second" as reported by Jessica Schladebeck of the New York Daily News, who is one of the only journalists to cover the event, was listed by some as a pro-gun rally. 


