## Sewer Project In Archer Heights

The City of Chicago has begun a \$1.9 million sewer replacement project which aims to improve drainage in the Archer Heights neighborhood, according to 14th Ward Alderman Edward M. Burke.

New sewers will be installed beneath 51st street, from Kenneth to Kostner Avenues and 52nd street from Kilbourn to Keeler.

The work began in mid-March and will be completed in August. The old sewer pipes date back to the 1920s.

The project is intended to improve drainage in an area roughly bounded by Archer ave. to the north, 53rd st. to the south, Keeler ave. to the east and Kilbourn ave. to the west.

Residents should watch for "No Parking" signs which will be posted as needed during work hours (7 a.m. to 4 p.m.).

## Illinois State Scholars At DeLaSalle

## Urge Ban On Powdered Alcohol

The City of Chicago would act to ban the sale of powdered alcohol just as the new product is expected to come on the market under an ordinance unveiled by 14th Ward Alderman Edward M. Burke.

The federal government will allow the Palcohol, a powdery substance made from freeze-dried alcohol, to be sold in packets.

"The possibilities for abuse concerning this product are endless," Burke warned. "This product is so light and transportable, that is could be slipped into a child's pocket and brought to school. It could also be easily put in someone's food or beverage without their knowledge."

Billed as "alcohol-on-the-go," each packet contains the equivalent of a shot of liquor and is intended to be mixed with water. The manufacturer

is seeking to make the product available as powdered rum and vodka and market it in four cocktail varieties: Mojito, Lemon Drop, Cosmopolitan and Powderita.

Medical experts have questioned if the product may pose a health risk to consumers unfamiliar with its potency. Even though Palcohol has yet to appear on store shelves, lawmakers in Alaska, Louisiana, South Carolina and Vermont have already banned the product. A bill in the State of New York is awaiting the governor's signature.

According to the legislation that was proposed in Chicago, no business "shall possess, sell, offer for sale, give away, barter, exchange or otherwise furnish on the licenses premises any powdered alcohol in the City of Chicago, or engage in an act of concealment of any powdered alcohol on the licenses premises." Violators of the measure would face fines ranging from \$2,000 to \$5,000 per offense. The proposal was sent for consideration to the License Committee.

## Promote Reading To Children 0-5

The Chicago Public Library has launched the "Take 20, Read Plenty" public awareness campaign to promote the importance of reading 20 minutes a day to children ages 0-5.

Research indicates that children are equipped with 100 billion neurons at birth, but pathways between the neurons are not yet established. Reading to children aids in strengthening those connections.

Moreover, the number of words a child is exposed to between the ages of zero and three are strong predictors of educational success and eventual economic stability.

Seminal research shows there is a thirty million word gap between families of lower and higher socioeconomic statuses, so children living in poverty tend to fall behind faster in their development and in school. Children need to hear at least 1,000 stories read aloud before they can learn to read themselves.

Each CPL location will have a reading nook in order to model the practice of reading aloud and to provide an atmosphere conducive to reading aloud.

## Counseling

I often run into people who read my articles. Often they have very interesting comments. One individual asked about what to do with children who have a traumatic experience, whether in a group or as an individual. She stated that she knows that dealing with her 11, 6 and 4 year olds that they are so different how could one counselor at school help them.

The multiple situations are difficult to generalize about. When CPS or the Archdiocese are informed about a situation, they send teams of counselors to the schools to help. The situations I am familiar with the extra counselors come to the school and sit around and wait for people to come seeking help, whether in a group or individually. I never had a group come in when I was in the high schools, but they came several times when I was in middle school and elementary school.

Sometimes the counselors see no one and sometimes they are busy. Some students: A) won't ask for help; B) don't think they need it; C) would like help but are embarrassed to ask; D) ask for help just to be out of class or with friends; and E) just to be nosy. The trouble with this is that the counselor doesn't know which of these groups the student or adult falls into and of course, must take every case seriously. The effort by the team while well-intentioned sometimes misses the problem due to lack of personal knowledge of the students. The students that seek the help are in my experience has been the girls. The guys usually refuse to go.

Most CPS counselors have little experience since Grad School with actually counseling. The sad truth is most spend a great amount of their time with paper work and have little time, through no fault of their own, to see troubled children. In an effort to help my students I used discretionary funds to help with counseling. Some years I hired a school community rep, other years a local parish youth minister, or a counselor from a private agency. These individuals I feel helped the students because they got to know them and had a lot of experience in counseling.

The situations with some students are hard to tell. I had a teacher tell me that a 4th grade student's father was killed over the weekend and we should see the student. I do not know what happened long term, but at the moment the student was quite happy about it, because, according to him, the man would beat his mother and he was glad to have him gone. I had another little boy whose apartment was on fire. He also seemed very happy, it seems the local church was taking care of them and the rent-free apartment and the new clothes were the best this kid had ever had.

One of the strangest situations I had to deal with was when a 7th grader's father was shot and killed a couple blocks from his home. The police informed me that the father was shot because he was mistaken for the son. I went with my school community rep and vis-

ited the home the next day to see of what assistance we could be. We told the mother seeing that these gang members knew where the son lived and where he went to school CPS would allow an emergency transfer. We were astonished to hear the mother say oh we're not moving, I have great rent here and can't give it up. We would not argue at this point with the mother, but I believe it's possible she needed more counseling than her son.

These lend credence to my neighbor's concern that all kids are different. The American School Counselor Association tells their counselors that we need counselors who listen more than the old-fashioned reassurance of things will be okay, because they could lose credibility when things don't get better. The American Federal of School Administrators states that 40% of children will face a death of a peer and 20% of the students will witness a death by the time they complete high school and 5% will lose a parent by the time they are 16. The key to these sad statistics is that you, as a parent or teacher, should try and look out for your kids and be prepared to deal with situations and all principals should check into all resources available. This is never an easy job and people have written entire books on the subject. The sad truth is it might happen to you and your loved ones.
