Zoogoers can warm up inside the Holly Jolly Theater, where choirs, dancers, and other local entertainers will give holiday-themed performances. The opening night's highlights include a jingle bell rockin' performance by Coal City High School Footnotes, a holiday show by Those Funny Little People, and a concert by Strings of the Valley. Guests will receive a list of entertainment and activities when they enter the zoo.

The laser show will light up a 40-foot-by-30-foot screen on the West Mall every 30 minutes between 5 and 8:30 p.m. There will be a new holiday light spectacular featuring festive-themed video on the Reptiles and Birds House. Christmas Remembered

Christmas is "the most wonderful time of the year" and that includes in school. Most people have fond memories of Christmases past. We have time designated by the politicians to celebrate Black History Month, Hispanic Heritage Month, Women's History, Asian Heritage, the Holocaust, and many others.

While these are worthy of remembering and teaching our children, how can it be wrong to celebrate peace and good will as in Christmas. How ridiculous.

I will admit that during my 35 years in the Chicago Public Schools, 20 as an administrator, and always in African American or Latino schools, we were careful, but did celebrate the good stories of love that Christmas brings.

Let me start with a story. When my mother was in third grade at the Sherman School during the depression, they were collecting pennies for the poor. She asked at home to contribute and her parents said sure, there is some money on the radio and she proudly took it to school. Then the teacher told my mother, "but Joy we are collecting for You".

I use this embarrassment of mom to make sure that I would try never to do this to kids. Therefore, when our schools were donated turkeys, hams, clothes or toys, I always held a free raffle and Santa drew the names. Shockingly enough, the neediest families always won and I received my biggest gift by seeing the joy of the tear

ful parents.

My nine years with the Archdiocese was easier to celebrate, but still had to be careful of family traditions. Some ethnic groups give gifts on St. Nicholas Day, Dec. 6th, others on the Epiphany, Jan. 6th. In all my schools, I tried to spread the word to the teachers to be accepting, after all, these are good things to perpetuate.

Many of you parents and students remember singing in assemblies. I personally loved singing in them. Yes, no matter how bad my voice was, it showed teachers to be human. I especially liked when I shared the stage with Santa and the kids were shocked it wasn't me.

Use this time to become close to your families. Merry Christmas.

First 8 Years Most Critical

While the state of Illinois has taken measures to ensure that children benefit from early care and educational programs, a new report from the Annie E. Casey Foundation finds more investments needed. A majority of pupils are not on track by third grade and the number is even lower for children living below the poverty level.

The president of Voices for Illinois Children, Gaylord Gieseke, said that the first eight years are crucial to a child's cognitive, social, emotional and physical development.

Illinois has implemented child-care assistance, home visiting, early intervention and other programs to support early development but many children don't get off to a strong start because of economic, language and other barriers.

The report: "The First Eight Years: Giving Kids a Foundation for Lifetime Success" is available at voices4kids.org.
