



Street Paving In 14th Ward



Mayor Rahm Emanuel and 14th Ward Alderman Edward M. Burke held a news conference to announce that road construction season is in full swing. Paving crews have completed more than 65 miles of street paving and are on track to fulfill the commitment of paving more than 300 miles of streets this year. Since 2011 more than 1,000 miles of streets have been paved. In the 14th Ward, more than \$650,000 in street resurfacing projects have been completed including: Kilpatrick, from 47th Street to Archer, at a cost of \$217,000; Melvina, from 51st to 52nd, at a cost of \$53,000; 44th Street, from Pulaski to Keeler, at a cost of \$144,000; Sacramento from 53rd to 55th at a cost of \$133,000; Homan from 43rd to 45th at a cost of \$106,000.

Narragansett was repaved from 51st to 53rd at a cost of \$106,000, a project that was funded through the Cook County Highways Department.

Later this summer, 51st street is slated to be resurfaced from Central to Normandy.

"All of these projects reflect a major reinvestment in our community which promise to revitalize our commercial areas and residential neighborhoods," Burke said.

Historical Exhibit At Billiard Club

Tom Foley, an Irish immigrant won the first formal billiard championship in 1865. In 1869, he recruited Chicago's first professional baseball team, the Chicago White Stockings (today's Chicago Cubs).

Mr. Foley also held public office, operated lavish downtown billiard rooms, authored historical billiard publications and in 1919, founded The Old Timers Baseball Association of Chicago.

Jim & Bonnie Parker, founders of the historical Illinois Billiard Club will also exhibit the original art work of sports cartoonist Willard Mullin.



"Too many families believe the dream of attending college is slipping away," Treasurer Michael Frerichs said. "It is important for families to know that the first steps to that dream can be taken for as little as \$25."

The Bright Start or Bright Directions college savings account are administered by the Treasurer's Office and can be opened at www.illinois-treasurer.gov. Pur-

chasers can choose investment options or use an advisor for guidance.

Age-based options where the underlying investments become more conservative as the beneficiary gets closer to college-age also are available. Savings can be used at any qualified institution nationwide, including technical schools.

These tax-advantaged college savings accounts are named after Section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code. In Illinois, 7 of 10 seniors graduated with college debt. The average balance was \$28,500.

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Fireworks Pose Safety Hazard

With the upcoming Fourth of July holiday, the Office of the State Fire Marshal reminds residents to leave fireworks to the experts. Many injuries and fires occur each year from these devices and should be used only by trained professionals.

Fireworks pose a danger to users and bystanders of all ages. As the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commissions explains, fireworks were responsible for an estimated 11,400 injuries and eight deaths in 2013.

Injuries typically result from the user playing with lit fireworks or igniting them while holding the device. Injuries can also be sustained from device malfunctions, such as errant flight paths, devices that tip over and blowouts.

Those at the greatest risk of injury are young children under the age of nine. Children often come in contact with devices that are perceived to be less powerful, such as sparklers and bottle rockets. However, all fireworks have the potential for causing damage and injury. Sparklers burn at temperatures of above 1,200 degrees - temperatures high enough to melt glass.
