## Changes in ACT

The ACT test has announced a new option in the test. Those parents who have children of high school age or older are already somewhat familiar with the ACT test. It is a nationally standardized exam that most four-year colleges use as a requirement for admission. Some of these schools also accept the SAT scores, but I could not find many that did not require at least one of these.

Despite the push by parents for good grades, the grades themselves are much less important than the score on the ACT. Why? The ACT is scored the same for everyone. Some teachers give grades quite easily and an A at one school might only be worth a B at another school, etc.

Until this year, the ACT was mandated as a graduation requirement throughout Illinois. But next Fall, September, 2020, many students will be allowed to retake individual sections of the test to improve their overall score.

These students include those who take the exam at one of the Saturday testing centers. These are schools scattered throughout the Chicagoland area and there are over 20 to choose from. You could choose by date or location. The ACT test has a \$52 charge and you are

allowed to take it again for another \$52. However, this change, you can just take a section. The four sections included are: English, Math, Reading and Science. The student may also take a Writing test for an additional \$16. A student next September will be able to retake a single section, if they wish for only \$16 a section.

What is the advantage to take sections or the entire test over? ACT will report the student's best score in each section. Research shows that this allows the recruiter to view the student's best effort.

Jayne Carlin Fonash, president of the National Association for College Admission Counselors, wants the students to talk with their counselor before going through the stress of retaking the test to decide whether the new score would help. We have heard news stories about rich personalities who paid big bucks to have scores altered and other such things to get their children into particular schools.

It had been stated in the newspapers that there were only a handful of schools that are extremely hard to get into. While the other schools have competition to get admission, it is much easier now to get into a university in general.

It is advisable to have the test as early as possible. Due to the CTU strike, many students have already had their ACT test delayed as an October date was cancelled because those schools could not be opened on a Saturday, which not only affected CPS students, but students from other districts as well.

The next test date is December 14th, but registration is by November 8th. I advise students to register for this because with one less date of testing, the seats may be limited. Students should take the test seriously but if it is too stressful, relax, it is not worth your health.



## Real Tax Bills Now on Email

About 60,000 property owners in Cook County should use cookcountrytreasurer.com to update the name or mailing address on their tax bills.

The online application replaces thousands of paper forms that the Treasurer's Office processes each year.

To help homeowners who have mail delivery problems, cookcountrytreasurer.com shows when tax bills have been returned by the U.S. Postal Service. The numbers of properties with incorrect mailing addresses has been reduced 60,062.

To see if your bills have been returned or to change the name and address on your bills, visit cookcountrytreasurer.com and select the purple box labeled "Your Property Tax Overview". Enter your address or Property Index Number. Look for a red warning box that appears if your bills have been returned. Selected "Update Your Information" to change the taxpayer name or mailing address.


To avoid mail, select "eBilling" on the website to receive your tax bill by email. Paper name/address change applications will continue to be accepted.
