The words Pearl Harbor bring about many thoughts. But it continues today to tell the story of the American Spirit. One of the many sad stories of that attack was the sinking of the USS Oklahoma. Many of you have seen movies about attack. The the Oklahoma was the ship hit by torpedoes and was capsized and a desperate effort was made to save sailors and marines who were trapped in the upside down ship as welders unsuccessfully tried to cut holes into the hull. The official total of

those killed on the Oklahoma was 429. Of those about 35 were almost immediately identified. The rest were buried in The National Memorial Cemetery in the Pacific, which is in an extinct volcano crater in

ent day ability of forensic scientist and their work with DNA about 388 of those that died on The Oklahoma are being exhumed from 46 plots in that cemetery in hopes to identify as many as possible. This is one of those intangibles that Americans expect. "We leave no one behind". While this is not always possible, there are always those trying to complete this pledge. There are still people trying to iden-

tify remains in Viet Nam. It has recently been reported that these forensic scientists have identified about 100 that were killed in the USS Oklahoma. After the families have been notified they have the opportunity to bring back the remains to a location of the families' choosing. The process is one of great solemnity and respect. Our young ones should realize that this "grateful nation" goes on forever.

Just a note on this 76th anniversary of The Day of Infamy, about 2400 died at Pearl Harbor with about 1200 on the USS Arizona and 400 on the USS Oklahoma. If you go to Hawaii, you should, as do most Americans and Japanese, pay the respect at Pearl. We, as a family, have visited American military cemeteries in Italy and Normandy. I hope I taught my children well. They are great places to pray for peace.



For some people becoming a policeman or a fireman is just a job. For others it is a calling. For Zoe Madere, a junior at Thomas Kelly High School, the call to duty is a proud family tradition. Zoe has multiple family members with careers in public service both in Chicago and California.

Zoe always knew she wanted to wear the uniform of a policeman or fireman. When asked why she wanted to join the Chicago Police and Firefighter Training Firefighter Training Academy, Zoe responded that she "wanted to follow in the footsteps of my other family members who devoted their lives to public safety and service.

When she was a soph-omore at Kelly she got the information about the CPFTA program from her counselor and filled out the application. She was accepted into the fighter training program her junior year. The Chicago Poand Firefighter lice Training Academy provides training for stuinterested dents in careers in public safety, law enforcement, criminal justice, and fire science. The CPFTA is a two-year program that fulfills the two career education or elective credits that all CPS high school students need to gradu-

ate. The Chicago Police and Firefighter Training accepts Academy only accepts about 250 students each year from all over the city. Students who are interested have to apply their sophomore year, and if they are accepted, the program starts their junior year. As a cadet in the firefighter training program, Zoe goes to the fire academy after school two days a week to train and study. According to ne "the academy pares the cadets mentally and physically and trains them to hold respect, honor, and integrity for a iob that demands a lot responsibility and discipline." According to Zoe, 'as first responders people are placing their lives in the hands of firefighters and policemen, and we have to live up the re-sponsibility. The acad-emy helps instill the type of discipline and integrity needed for such an important role in society. Cadets in the program receive transportation assistance to get to either the Police Academy or the Fire Academy after school. Cadets are also eligible to participate in a paid summer internship between junior and sen· ior year and for financial assistance to attend one of the City Colleges of Chicago to complete an Associate's Degree after high school. They can also earn OSHA, Cyber Security Safety, Un-armed Security Guard and CPR/FA/AED certifications with instructional materials provided at no extra cost. Cadets can also apply to take the EMT-B state licensure class for state certification. A typical day at the academy includes a lot of physical conditioning, such as running, doing push-ups, suicide runs, planks, squats, bear walks, burpies, and jumping jacks. They also take classes in fire science, first aid, and other aspects of public safety. Cadets are expected to be in proper uniform and act in a respectable manner when they arrive at the academy each day. Zoe said it is all a lot of hard work but knows it will all be worth it, and she values the experience and training she is getting. Congressman Dan Lipinski joined with officials from the Metropoli-tan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago, and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, to announce the completion of McCook Reservoir Stage 1, a 3.5 billion gallon sec-tion of the McCook Reservoir, part of the Tunnel and Reservoir Plan. As the House Trans-

portation and Infrastructure Committee was drafting the 2016 Water Resources Development Act, which was signed into law last year, Lipinski secured a provision that prioritized funding and accelerated the construction timeline for the next flood control project, McCook Reservoir Stage

When that project is completed, the reservoir will have a total storage capacity of 10 billion gallons and deliver an addi-tional \$143 million per year in flood reduction benefits. TARP is one of the

country's largest public works projects for flood control and pollution. It covers a 375-square-mile area that includes Chicago and 51 suburbs that rely on a combined collection system.




