city.
This Assessment, coled and co-designed with people and organizations who live with these issues day, identifies neighborhoods that experience the greatest cumulative impacts. It also reinforces and supports the requirements of the City's voluntary compliance agreement with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development announced

Recognizing that environmental protection and public health require a whole-of-government approach, the Assessment also provides strate-

gies and actionable policy recommendations guide decision-making on issues such as land use/zoning, permitting, enforcement, transportation planning, and more.

The baseline Assessment was conducted by the Chicago Department of Public Health, Office of Climate & Environmental Equity and the City's Environmental Equity Working Group from May 2022 to August 2023.

"Falls are a leading cause of injuries for people aged 65 and older," said IDoA Director Paula Basta. "While prevention is always the goal, it's important to be prepared for a fall and have a plan to get help quickly. The addition of automatic fall detection technology to EHRS can provide extra security for older adults who are at a high risk of

falling. Eligible older adults are provided a two-way voice communication system consisting of a base unit and an activation device typically a pendant necklace, but wrist and waist devices are also available. Pushing a button on the device will link the adult to a professionally staffed support center within 60 seconds. Support center personnel are trained to dispatch first responders or alert a preselected emergency contact, such as a neighbor or family member.

The new technology can recognize falls when they happen and automatically notify a local

support center. Participants will also have the option to up-grade their pendant to one with GPS monitoring, expanding protection outside the range of the base unit in their home. Older adults will be protected from falls in their yard, driveway, while shopping, and doing other activities outside the home.

EHRS participants should contact their Care Coordinator for questions about the forthcoming service enhancements. Older adults seeking to receive EHRS must meet all physical and financial eligibility criteria for the Community Care Program and can contact ĬDoA's Senior HelpLine at 1-800-252-8966 about the



Chicago Public Schools opened the GoCPS application window, allowing students to begin exploring their educational options for the 2024-25 school year. From until 5 p.m. on Nov. 9th, students who will be entering grades K-9 in the 2024-25 year can begin applying for a wide variety of academic programs.

As part of the District's ongoing effort to promote a more equitable enroll-ment process, CPS reduced the length of high school admissions test to one hour, down from two and a half hours, and will offer the assessment in six languages.

Students also have the opportunity to attend a variety of schools with programs to meet their diverse needs. Families can learn more at a GoCPS Information Session – available in both English and Spanish - by registering online.

Every student is guaranteed a seat within the general education program of the neighborhood school associated with their home address. However, students and families can use the GoCPS application to explore programs that best fit their needs. High school and elementary school applicants must complete the GoCPS application by 5 p.m. on Nov. 9th.

Students entering high school in the 2024-25 school year can apply to a variety of programs, including selective enroll-International Baccalaureate, Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math, Fine and Performing Arts, Service Leadership Academies, Career and Technical Education, Dual-Language

programs and more. Students applying to selective enrollment high schools and many choice high school programs must complete the HSAT as part of their applica-
