

VFW Sponsors Essay Contest

State Commander Phil Maughan of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Department of Illinois announced the kick-off of this year's VFW's Voice of Democracy Scholarship competition. High school students have the opportunity to compete for thousands of dollars in scholarships and a trip to Washington, D.C.

Students must write and record a three-to-five minute essay on the theme "My Vision For America" using an audio CD or flash drive and present their recording, typed essay and completed entry form to their local VFW Post by November 1. Post winners compete at the District level with the winner advancing to the state competition.

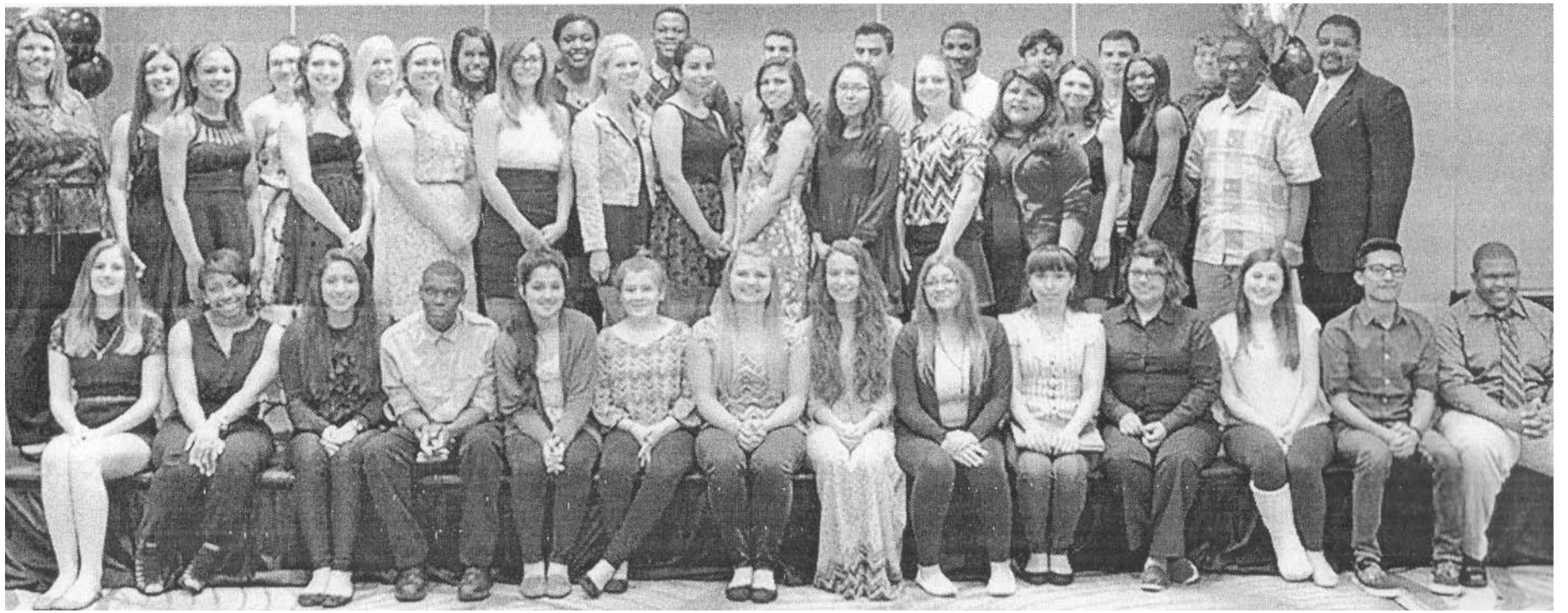
All state first-place winners receive a four day trip to Washington, D.C. and the chance to compete for their share of

more than \$150,000 in scholarships. The first-place winner receives a \$30,000 college scholarship.

The National Association of Broadcasters started the Voice of Democracy Scholarship program in 1947. The VFW became a national sponsor in the late 1950s and assumed sole responsibility for the program in 1961. The competition was created to provide students grades 9-12 the opportunity to express themselves in regard to democratic ideas and principles. Around 40,000 students participate and VFW awards more than \$2 million in scholarships every year.

Marquette Bank Awards Scholarships to 60 Graduating Seniors

Completion For Cal-Sag Trail West

Commissioner Mariyana Spyropoulos, President of the Board at the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago announced that the west segment of the Cal-Sag Trail is now open.

When complete, the Cal-Sag Trail will connect 14 communities within the Southland and Millennium Reserve

area, from Lemont to the Burnham Greenway near the Indiana border. The eastern segment is scheduled to be complete by 2017.

The 13-mile western segment runs along the Cal-Sag Channel from 131st st. and Cicero ave. in Alsip on the east to Archer ave. and Route 83 on the west end. Much of it runs through Cook County Forest Preserves, and it connects with several existing bike trails in the forest preserve system.

The 529 college savings plans took center stage on May 29th during a national effort to discuss college expectations and goals with children.

"Too many families believe the dream of attending college is slipping away," Treasurer Michael Frerichs said. "It is important for families to know that the first steps to that dream can be taken for as little as \$25."

The Bright Start or Bright Directions college savings account are administered by the Treasurer's Office and can be

opened at www.illinoisinvestor.gov. Purchasers can choose investment options or use an advisor for guidance. Age-based options where the underlying investments become more conservative as the beneficiary gets closer to college-age also are available. Savings can be used at any qualified institution nationwide, including technical schools.

These tax-advantaged college savings accounts are named after Section 529 of the Internal Revenue Code. In Illinois, 7 of 10 seniors graduated with college debt. The average balance was \$28,500.

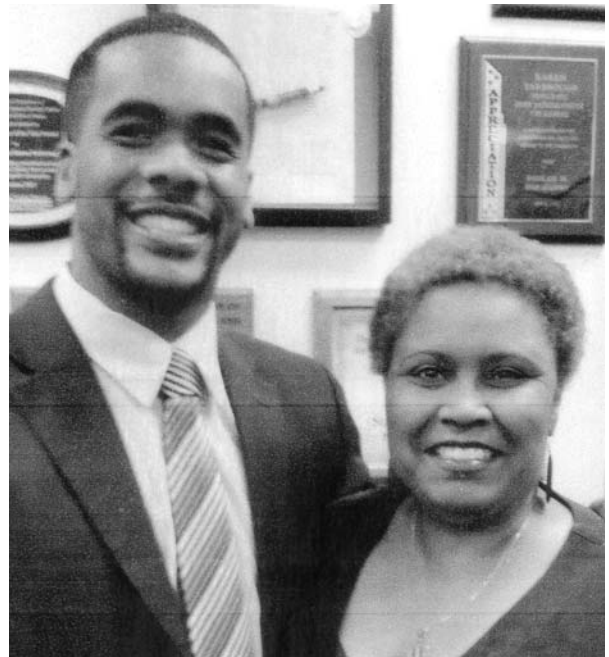

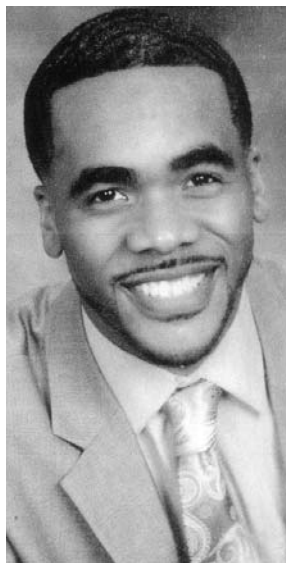
