Curie Artwork At A-H Library



There are many students in our neighborhood that are home schooled in various levels from K - 12. Those involved have chosen this way of education for their children for many reasons. Among those parents who have confided with me use the reasons: 1. religious reasons and lack of nearby Christian schools. 2. fear of gangs. 3. parents having a less than successful experience in school themselves. 4. less government interference. 5. Grandma was an immigrant, but they want their kids to be American and they perceive that some school systems push a different agenda. 6. A few admit to being "helicopter parents", and 7. differences in opinion with school staff.

Over the years I had many students I wish would have been home schooled, but no luck, their parents didn't want them around all day either. The Center for Online Learning and Students with Disabilities at the University of Kansas study found many online programs used by these parents do not truly meet the needs of students with disabilities.


They found that the content does not meet the principles of Universal Design for Learning. They suggest that if you plan to use a program, you should utilize the UDL scan tool which is available online. This can help you decide if a program is appropriate for a program you are considering to use. It is hard to imagine that any parent can be expert enough in the various grades and subjects to give the proper help in every situation. I met a lady from Oregon who home schools her children and she did not graduate high school. But before you consider that, laws vary by state.

It is especially important to consider any outside help carefully, especially if you think your child might have a learning disability. There are a lot of organizations that help parents get together to share concerns and abilities. It also helps for those who worry about the socialization skills. These programs, which are easy to find on the internet, can be a significant tool in helping educate the home schooled.

Festival of Flight At Brookfield Zoo

Festival of Flight, an inspirational bird presentation, will appear at Brookfield Zoo through Labor Day, Sept. 5th.

Guests will look on in awe as Palmer, a palm cockatoo, glides inches above their heads and as an Andean condor displays its incredible 10-foot wingspan. Zoogoers will chuckle as a kea parrot named Ike teaches onlookers how to properly recycle and as Gabby and Happy Jack, two yellow-headed Amazon parrots, sing some of their favorite songs. In addition, members of the audience may want to bring some extra cash, as a crow scans the crowd for donations that will help support endangered species in the wild.

Conservation is woven throughout the show to inspire caring and to urge the audience to action. Zoogoers will hear about endangered blue-throated macaws which estimated at just over 100 remaining in the wild.

The Festival of Flight will feature more than 20 species of birds, including blue-throated and scarlet macaws, hooded vultures, Eurasian eagle owls, Harpy eagles, double yellow-headed Amazon parrots, Harris

hawks, Abyssinian ground hornbills and ravens. The birds are trained by renowned animal behaviorist Steve Martin and his team of trainers.

The 20-minute presentation will take place west of Tropic World habitat at 11:30 a.m., 1:30 p.m., and 3:30 p.m. daily. Through August 13th, shows on Fridays will be at 1:30 p.m., 3:30 p.m., and 7:00 p.m. and on Saturdays at 11:30 a.m., 1:30 p.m., 3:30 p.m., and 7 p.m.

Brookfield Zoo is celebrating 50 years of the iconic Mold-A-Rama® plastic statue machines. In addition to a special 50th anniversary bison at the Memory Lane Tent, the following statuettes will be sold: 1966 walrus (at The Carousel), 1973 lion (on the North Mall), 2005 camel during August (at The Carousel) and 1980s rhino during August (on the North Mall).

Throughout the year, the 13 machines located around park offer a variety of animal and seasonal figures, including a dolphin, giraffe, and polar bear at a cost of \$2. Staff from Mold-A-Rama will be at the Memory Lane Tent on Saturday, July 16th, from 4 to 6 p.m. to meet guests and to answer any questions. A Hall of Fame display will feature figures from past years and hats and t-shirts will be sold. The plastic figures were first invented by Tike Miller, who in the late 1950s sold the rights to his souvenir-making machine to Automatic Retailers of America.
