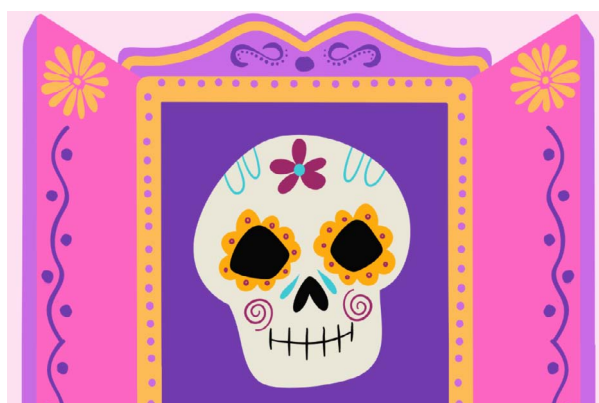

4,844 Entries For New State Flag

Illinois Secretary of State Alexi Giannoulias announced the Flag Commission received 4,844 entries during the six-week submission period that closed Oct. 18th.

Beginning in January, the public will have the opportunity to vote online for one of 10 new designs, or one of the 3 former designs, including the current state flag, the 1918 Centennial Flag and 1968 Sesquicentennial Flag. After a public feedback period, the commission will report its findings to the Illinois General Assembly by April 1st, whose members will vote on whether to adopt a new flag, return to a previous iteration or retain the current one.

The state flag has not had a major redesign since 1915.

Respiratory Virus Season Begins

The Illinois Department of Public Health is reminding the public that October brings the start of respiratory virus season. Illinoisans are urged to safeguard them from illnesses that surge during the fall and winter, including COVID-19, flu and RSV. This includes getting vaccinated.

The Department has upgraded its Seasonal Respiratory Illness Dashboard and has posted two new FAQ documents on its website providing the latest guidance on vaccinations and how to get tested and treated. A new Respiratory Illness Data Channel provides nationwide information for anyone planning to travel out of state.

Anyone with respiratory symptoms – such as coughing, a runny nose, or fever – should try to self-isolate unless they need to seek medical care.

The new vaccines are available at pharmacies and through hospitals, and community health clinics. The major pharmacy chains allow you to make an appointment to get a shot online. For help finding a provider of vaccines, go to www.vaccines.gov.

The eligible owner-occupied property must be located in Chicago. Property must be in habitable condition. Property cannot be at risk of foreclosure. All utilities must be current and in working order.

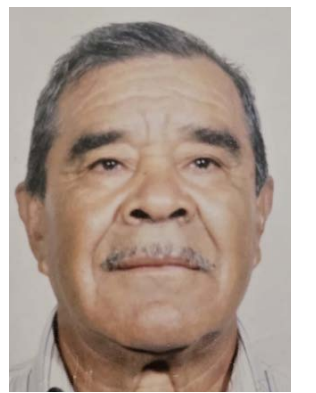
