First Installment Tax Year 2023 property taxes are due Friday, March 1st, Cook County Treasurer Maria Pappas reminded taxpayers

Nearly 1.8 million bills were posted online at cookcountytreasurer.com in December and mailed printed bills to taxpayers in late January.

Partial payments are accepted from those unable to pay the full amount. After March 1st, any balance due is charged 0.75% per month, as required by state law. Illinois law-makers in 2023 approved reforms, championed by reforms championed by Pappas that reduced the interest rate penalty from 1.5% to 0.75 per month, or from 18% to 9% annu-

ally.

Sheriff Promotes Firearm Restraint

Cook County Sheriff Thomas J. Dart is raising public awareness about an underutilized tool for the public that can remove firearms from individuals who pose an immediate and present danger to themselves or

others.
"Undoubtably, there right are people out there right now who know someone who is an immediate danger and has access to firearms. This law can help, but too few people know about it," Sheriff Dart said. "We need to get the word out to residents that the firearm restraining order can be a critical part of protecting themselves and their families, particularly in a mental health or domestic situation.

Firearm The Restraining Order Act, also known as Illinois'
"Red Flag" law, allows
police officers, family
members, and household members to petition their circuit court to remove firearms from those who are presently exhibiting threatening behavior and poses an immediate and present danger of causing injury. Members of the public can file petitions themselves or inquire with their local law enforcement agency for assistance.

Expert Tips For Spring Cicadas

Ahead of the historic spring 2024 emergence of periodical cicadas in Illinois, the tree experts at The Morton Arboretum are sharing tips on how to protect young and other vulnerable trees and shrubs from potential damage.

broods Large cicadas will be found across a wide area of the United States this spring, with 13- and 17-year varieties emerging in May. Central and southern Illinois will experience 13-year cicadas, while 17year cicadas will emerge in areas north of Springfield, including the Chicago region.

Damage to trees occurs when female cicadas lay their eggs in small slits on twigs, made with a long, knife-like ovipositor.

arrive, cover small trees and shrubs, including those with few developed branches, with a fine protective netting, such as
