Do You Recall Ashli Babbitt?

In a conversation with several college freshmen, none of them knew the name Ashli Babbitt. This fact helped me consider that her story might be interesting for those who have not heard of the January 6, 2021 con-frontation at the Capitol Building in Wahington,

There were about 100 arrested for the incident and they list about 460 that have been found quilty with prices. found guilty with prison sentences from 7 months to 20 years. form, she was the only one to die. It was from a Washington, DC police department. There was an investigation and they charged her for participating in a riot and a few

The Illinois Department on Aging is encouraging everyone with Medicare to check if their plan still meets their needs and budget during this year's Open Enrollment Period, which runs Dec. through Individuals can get free help comparing health and drug plan options by contacting the state's Senior Health Insurance Program.

Counselors are available in person and online throughout the year, but are especially helpful during Open Enrollment when people with Medicare can join or switch health and prescription drug plans for the coming year. For those who switch plans, coverage starts on Jan. 1,

New for 2025, yearly out-of-pocket costs for Medicare drug plan-covered prescription drugs will be capped at \$2,000. People with Medicare Part D prescription drug plans can also choose to spread their out-of-pocket costs across the calendar year instead of paying all at once at the pharmacy.

The City of Chicago is implementing a series of changes to consolidate the New Arrivals shelter system, accelerate the resettlement of current shelter residents, and move toward the One System Initiative. The current New Arrivals mission will end Dec. 31,

This shift will focus on adding 3,800 beds to the 3,000 legacy DFSS beds in the homelessness services system in collaboration with State of Illinois partners and advocates.

The Department of Family and Support Services will continue to administer shelter services and lead the operational transition. Those arriving in Chicago will have access to the 311 system to request shelter. DFSS will share a resource guide with information about City Key, community-based organizations, food pantries,

legal services, and more. Changes include: Elimination of the 30-day shelter extensions based on the "Public Benefit enrollment" extension for anyone currently in the New Arrivals shelter system or newly entering

Payroll Jobs Up Unemployment Stable

The Illinois Department of Employment Security announced that nonfarm payrolls were up +7,100 while the unemployment rate was unchanged at 5.3 percent in September, based on preliminary data provided by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The August monthly change in payrolls was revised from the preliminary report, from +800 to +6,700 jobs, while the revised unemployment rate was 5.3 percent, unchanged from the preliminary August unemployment rate. The September payroll jobs estimate, and unemployment rate reflect activity

for the week including the 12th. In September, the industry sectors with the largest over-the-month job gains included: Private Education and Health Services (+4,600), Leisure and Hospitality (+3,600), and Government (+2,800). The industry sectors with the largest monthly payroll job declines included: Financial Activities (-3,000), Professional and Business Serv-(-3,000),

Construction (-1,300). The state's unemployment rate was +1.2 percentage points higher than the national unemployment rate reported for September. The national unemployment rate was 4.1 percent in September, down -0.1 percentage point from the previous month. The Illinois unemployment rate was up +0.6 percentage irom a vear ago when it was 4.7 percent.

Compared to a year ago, total nonfarm payroll jobs increased by +35,400jobs. The industry groups with the largest jobs increases included: Government (+43,500), Private Education and Health Services (+28,500), and Other Services (+10,100). The industry groups with the largest jobs decreases included: Professional and Business Services (-32,000), Financial Activi-(-9,000),Information (-3,600). In September, total nonfarm payrolls were up +0.6 percent over-the-year in Illinois and up +1.6 percent

in the nation. The number of unemployed workers was 343,700, up +0.2 percent from the prior month, and up +12.9 percent over the same month one year ago. The labor force was almost unchanged (0.0 percent) over-the-month and up +1.0 percent over-theyear. The unemployment rate identifies those individuals who are out of work and seeking employment. An individual who exhausts or is ineligible for benefits is still reflected in the unemployment rate if they actively seek work.

IDES helps connect jobseekers to employers who are hiring in a number of ways, including hosting and co-hosting job fairs and hiring events with statewide workforce partners, and through maintaining Illinois JobLink (IJL), the state's largest job search engine. IJL is a tool used by jobseekers to look for work, and by employers who can post open and available positions for hire and browse resumes. Recently, IJL showed 59,842 posted resumes with 87,316 jobs available.
