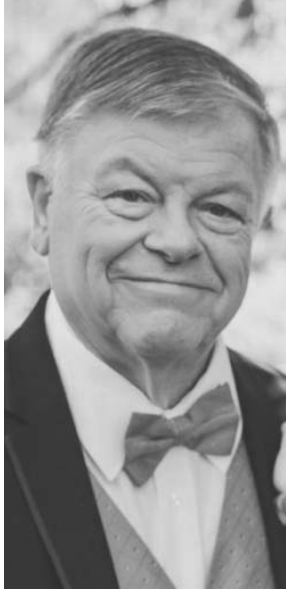


Thanksgiving and 55 Years Since JFK

Health Care Insurance Rates

The Illinois Department of Insurance (DOI) released its on-Exchange health care rate and plan analysis for Plan Year 2019, showing that rates have stabilized for the first time in recent years.
Average rates for the 2019 lowest cost silver plans decreased four percent and the lowest cost gold plans decreased by six percent from last year. Overall, rates for the lowest cost bronze plans modestly increased approximately six percent, far less than the 20 percent increase reported for 2018 rates.
Illinois consumers in all counties will have options to purchase health insurance coverage on the Exchange.
Individuals and small businesses can purchase their health insurance on the GCI website. Because GCI facilitates the federal subsidies, consumers are able to see their monthly premium at the discounted price.
DOI is advising consumers enrolling or re-enrolling in coverage to start shopping early, due to the six week enrollment period set by the federal government, and to look at all options available to them on and off the Exchange, from November 1, 2018 to December 15, 2018.

Medicaid Drugs For Hepatitis C

The Legal Council for Health Justice and the AIDS Foundation of Chicago praised the Illinois Department of Health and Family Services' announcement ending the policy of rationing coverage of drugs to cure hepatitis C for Medicaid participants.
Approximately 68,400 of those affected live in Illinois. Previously, individuals enrolled in Medicaid were required to have severe liver damage before gaining access to treatment. Some Medicaid enrollees were required to be sober for six months before they were granted access to medication.
The new policy makes a recognized hepatitis C cure — Direct Acting Antivirals, or DAAs — accessible for thousands of Illinoisans, many of whom were previously denied treatment until they reached end-stage disease.

Shared Cost Sidewalk Program

Mayor Rahm Emanuel announced that as part of his 2019 proposed budget, the City of Chicago will expand its Shared Cost Sidewalk Program, increasing funding by \$1 million to meet the high demand for the popular program.
Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis through the 311 system at the beginning of each year.
The cost per square foot charged to property owners is well below what a private contractor would charge. Senior citizens and persons with disabilities may qualify to receive a 50 percent discount. The cost to a property owners of an average mid-block property generally ranges from \$800 to \$1,500.
CDOT engineers conduct sidewalk condition surveys, calculate the proposed cost and send an invoice to the property owner. Property owners then have 45 days to accept the proposed cost and agree to participate.
