Mass commemorating Saint John Paul II's visit to Five Holy Martyrs Parish will be celebrated on Sunday, Oct.4th at 11 a.m. at the Papal Altar in the Parish parking lot. This bi-lingual Polish-English celebration is well attended by many cultural, civic and Parish organizations - a beautiful representation of Polonia in Chicago.

The main celebrant and homilist at the Mass will be Rev. Pawel Bandurski, Provincial of the Society of Christ Fathers in North America. In case of inclement weather, the mass will be celebrated in the church.

During this year's Papal Anniversary Mass, it will be the fifth time that we will not only pray and thank God for the gift and presence of Saint John Paul II among us, but we will also pray to him, asking him to continually bless us and intercede for us. For 31 years, Pope John Paul II has been with us spiritually during these anniversary Masses, but since 2011, he has been with us during the Mass physically - in the presence of his

blood. On Sept. 24th, 2011, Five Holy Martyrs Parish was very fortunate to have received a relic of Saint John Paul II from His Eminence, Stanislaw Cardinal Dziwisz, the Archbishop of Krakow, Poland, and the former personal secretary to Pope John Paul II. The relic is a drop of Saint John Paul II's blood on a

cloth protected by a lunula, a small, round glass encasement. The lunula has been mounted into a reliquary, a vessel in which a relic is held and exposed.

Since receiving this relic, Five Holy Martyrs Parish has begun a new tradition on the first weekend of every month by offering up our peti-tions to God through his intercession and venerating his relic at the weekend Masses; reciting a prayer to him as a community of believers; and finally by receiving a special blessing with the relic at the end of Mass. Immediately after the Sunday 9 a.m. English Mass and the 11 a.m. Polish Mass, parishioners and friends are invited to gather in the Bishop Abramowicz Parish Hall for cake, coffee, and fellowship.

We hope that everyone will mark their calendars to attend this unique celebration at 11 a.m. on Sunday, Oct. 4th. It is a wonderful reason for family and friends to come back to Brighton Park and reminisce. All cultural, civic and neighborhood organizations are invited to attend and walk in the entrance procession. Refreshments will be served in the Bishop Abramowicz Hall imme-

Latinos Appeal For **Blood Donations**

In conjunction with Blood Cancer Awareness Month and National Hispanic Heritage Month, Chicago Aldermen gathered at City Hall to kick off their "Dona Sangre, Salva 3 Vidas" campaign, and call for increased volunteers to donate blood and join the bone marrow registry, among Latino population.

Though Latinos makeup the largest minority of the US population at 17% (24% in Chicago), they make up less than 4% of blood donors. Yet majority of Latinos (nearly 60%) have type O blood, the universal blood type. Margaret Vaughn,

Government Affairs Director of the IL Coalition of Community Blood Centers explained, "Latino blood contains certain antibodies, unique to the Latino population, which are critical when an exact antigen match is required for a transfusion.

While Illinois' blood centers rely heavily on all blood types, Vaughn explained how type O positive blood is especially valuable. It is the most common blood type, which means it's most in demand, but if you have type O blood, only a type transfusion will work for you. However, people with other blood types can receive type O blood and it is often used to with infants and to treat accident victims when there is not time to test blood type.

Javiar Macias of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society explained ĥow his organization exists to find cures and ensure access to treatments for blood cancer patients and how blood donation plays a critical role.

There is also a great demand for Latinos to join the national bone marrow registry. Thousands of patients each year are in need of a marrow/stem cell transplant for blood related diseases and a patient is more likely to find a match from someone of their own ethnic background. Yet, Latinos make up only 10% of the
