It might be over-simplified, but it does imply that we don't need to constantly look for new curriculum when the old ones had better results. Property Tax Savings

Cook County Assessor Fritz Kaegi announces that the deadline to apply for exemptions is Friday, August 4th. Exemptions are property tax savings that contribute to lowering a homeowner's property tax bill. The

most common is the Homeowner Exemption, saving a property owner an average of \$950 dollars each year. The savings from exemptions are reflected on a homeowner's second installment property tax bill. This is the first time

in two years that homeowners need to reapply for the Senior Freeze and Disabilities Exemptions. It is important that we reach senior and veteran communities to make sure they aren't missing out on these significant savings," said Assessor Kaegi. "My office is col-laborating with community partners to help reach these particular homeowners.

Automatic renewals related to COVID-19 ended this year and homeowners need to resume annual filings for the Low-Income Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze "Senior Freeze" and Veterans with Disabilities Exemptions. Seniors and Veterans that need to reapply were mailed application booklets, however they can still apply online to make the deadline.

New homeowners, first-time applicants, or those that need to reapply can now do so online by visiting, www.cookcountyassessor.com/exem ptions. Applying online is easy, free, and can be done in under ten min-

2,000 Opioid Deaths For 2022

The Cook County Medical Examiner's Office has confirmed 2,000 opioid overdose deaths for 2022, breaking the previous record of 1,935 set in 2021. More than 91% of opioid overdose deaths involved fentanyl which is up to 50 times more potent than heroin and 100 times more potent than mor-

78% of the deaths are male. African Americans make up 56%, Latinos just under 15% and whites constitute 29%.

The age group most impacted is 50- to 59year-olds, accounting for 27% of the deaths. The youngest opioid overdose death in Cook County was a 12-year-old boy and the oldest was an 84year-old woman.

The Museum of Science and Industry, Chicago has unveiled a powerful, immersive experience – The Blue Paradox – where visitors can walk beneath the ocean's surface, explore the impact plastic pollution has on this vital natural resource, and discover the actions needed to stop plastic waste from becoming pollution.

Presented by SC Johnson, in partnership with Conservation Interna-tional, The Blue Paradox was initially launched in 2021 as an immersive pop-up experience in London. The high-demand, sold-out event struck a nerve with 97 percent of

attendees saying they planned to change their behavior for good.

The exhibit aims to illuminate a paradox when it comes to plastic use: while the widespread use of plastic in our daily lives of plastic in our daily lives has led to considerable advancements in modern so-

ciety, increased convenience, and reduced reliance on natural resources, it has become one of the most pervasive pollution issues facing our ocean ecosystem and the planet.

nipresent issue, the plaspollution crisis continues to make headlines. About 26 billion pounds of plastic is dumped into the ocean each year. Further, scientists continue to sound the alarm about plastic pollution in the Great Lakes region, estimating 22 million pounds of plastic enter the lakes annually. Researchers have even discovered 12 types of microplastics commonly found in bottles and packaging in the lungs of liv-

ing people, in addition to previous studies that have shown plastic particle pollution in human blood.



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



Gender Change On **Birth Certificates**

The Illinois Department of Public Health announced that it became easier for residents to change the gender listed on their birth certificate. The update to the state's Vital Records Act that took effect at the conclusion of Pride Month was enacted under HB0009 which allows people to change the gender on their birth certificate by signing a statement affirming their gender identity or intersex condition.

Until now, transgender and intersex Illinoisans seeking to change the gender on their birth certificate were required to provide certification from a health care professional that the individual had undergone gender reassignment surgery or other clinical treatment. The change makes gender-affirming documentation more accessible and recognizes the distinction between biological sex and gender for many

transgender individuals. For information about how to make changes to an Illinois birth certificate, including making corrections, changing the gender, and changing gender with a name change, go to the IDPH Birth Records page on the department's website.

To request a gender change, individuals must submit by regular mail a signed and notarized affidavit of correction, a copy of their current ID and a \$15 fee for processing to the IDPH Division of Vital Records.

Safety Tips For Extreme Heat

July is National Extreme Heat Safety Month and the Illinois Emer-Management gency Agency and Office of Homeland Security has some easy tips to keep you cool.

Extreme heat is defined as two to three days of heat and humidity with successive 90+ degree days. In July 1995, a heat wave contributed to more than 700 deaths in the Chicago area.

Extreme heat safety awareness tips include: About 40 percent of unwanted heat buildup in homes is through windows. Use awnings or curtains to deflect the sun. Fans will move air around, but does not lower your temperature. Use air conditioning inside your home or visit a store or local mall. Urban homes are more at risk of extreme heat, so know your local cooling centers Wear light-colored, loosefitting, and lightweight clothing.

Avoid strenuous activity during mid-day. Hydrate with water, not caffeinated or alcoholic beverages. Never leave children or pets in a vehicle. Get trained in first aid to help when someone is suffering from heat ill-

Check on neighbors, friends, family, and elderly who are more vulnerable to extreme heat.

Legislation For Health Insurance

Governor JB Pritzker applauded the full passage of House Bills 579 and 2296, which will create a state-based health insurance marketplace and institute the first rate review process in Illinois to protect consumers from

unnecessary rate hikes. House Bill 579 identifies underinsured communities, conducts effective outreach and assists in the enrollment process.

House Bill 2296 advances health care affordability by protecting consumers and small businesses from unfair premium rate hikes. Insurance companies will have to provide information about how they set their rates and the Department of Insurance will have the authority to deny rate hikes.


