Enrollment For LIHEAP Program

During the month of October, qualifying customers can apply for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) prior to the general enrollment period. General enrollment for all other qualified customers will begin on Nov. 1st.

LIHEAP is a federal block grant that provides resources to states to help low-income families meet their energy assistance needs. The program provides heating assistance to low- and fixed-income residents and allows a one-time annual payment to help offset a consumer's energy costs.

Under the income guidelines a household's combined monthly income for the 30 days prior to application may not exceed 150 percent of the federally established poverty level. For more information or to locate a local application agency, call 877-411-9276.

State Grant For Focal Point

Governor Pat Quinn announced that Chicago-based Focal Point, a leading manufacturer of architectural lighting, will expand its headquarters at 4141 S. Pulaski.

The project will enable Focal Point to retain its existing workforce of nearly 400 people and create at least 50 new jobs within two years. Focal Point had considered moving to Indiana or Missouri, but chose to remain in Illinois because of its highly-trained workforce, central location and connections to global markets.

The expansion was made possible by a state incentive package worth approximately \$2.9 million under Illinois' Economic Development for a Growing Economy. Administered by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, companies must meet agreed-upon targets for job creation or retention and capital investment to receive the credits. It is available to companies that can show they are considering sites outside of Illinois. The investment also includes \$156,500 for job training.

The Election

This coming Tuesday, November 4th, is going to be a great day. First, it will be a continuation of free elections in the United States; second, it is a great educational opportunity for our students; and third, we will no longer have to hear about Schneider and Dold every two minutes on TV (the ads aren't even paid for by people in the district).

Though this is not a presidential election, I'd like to share an educational activity that one of the best teachers I ever worked with, John Piegari, used on his classes. John taught at Evergreen, De La Cruz, and Nightingale before passing away with ALS. Many teachers use the mock election materials provided by the various student magazines. These are all fine but John, with my approval, went even deeper. As you probably guess, the students voted just like the adults in their neighborhoods, about 75% for the Democratic candidate. John asked the students why they voted the way they did. The most common replies were: that's who my parents like; all the people of my ethnic group vote that way; I don't like the other candidate. The next step he took was to survey the students on what issues the students felt were most important.

Following published data, stating that most Americans look at between three and five issues during an election, he took the five that were most important to the middle grade students. He then made up a series of choices. They were not in sequence but they were rated from most liberal to most conservative.

The issues during the 2012 campaign were: A) racism; B) jobs; C) use of the military; D) abortion; and E) immigration laws. When points were added up the children were very conservative and using this criteria 86% should have voted Republican, 4% Independent and 10% Democratic. He had similar results in previous election years. How valid are these results? These type of questions are used all over the internet. My daughter took one in college and was surprised to

find that she should have voted for Huckabee. Beyond this the results were repeatable and were similar at Nathan Davis, De La Cruz, Nightingale and St. Paul. These schools were all similar ethnically and economically. Sounds a lot like people we know. Grandpa got a job from this party so I owe them my vote. Some even still believe they if vote the wrong way, their garbage won't be picked up. So I guess the point is, the children can see the difference between belonging to a particular party that may or may not express their views or vote in a manner that might support their own philosophy of life.
