City Announces Input Sessions

The City of Chicago announced plans to gather community input on policing efforts as well as the expansion of alternate response models are aimed at strengthening safety and ensuring in need of assistance are met with the appropriate resources.

Community engagement sessions will begin this month and continue through early 2025. This engagement process was co-created with the Mayor's Office of Mayor's Community Safety, the Chicago Police Department, and community partners to advance the Mayor's People's Plan for Community Safety and the Chicago Police Chicago reform Department's progress and consent decree compliance.

Eight communitybased organizations have been selected to develop and implement a process to gather community feedback that will be used to inform the development and expansion of streams Chicago's public safety work, all of which are in early stages of development.

Community Policing: CPD is working to adopt comprehensive approach that will prioritize relationship and trustbuilding with citizens.

Workforce Allocation Study and Model: This study, which is required by City ordinance and consent decree will examine the department's staffing levels across every bureau and rank, including civilian positions.

911

Alternate Response: The City is exploring new response models for a range of resident needs to prioritize efficient allocation of City and police resources. These models are geared toward improving specialized response care and equitable outcomes during 911 responses that do not require a police skillset. The City is building on the work of Crisis Assistance Response and Engagement program, a 911 response that sends City employees from the Department of Public Health - a Crisis Clinician and an Medical Emergency Technical - to meet the needs of those in a behavioral or mental health cri-

The community-based organizations chosen to lead the community engagement were selected by a cross-sector panel of stakeholders based on an open, competitive process.

Winter Ban On Overnight Parking

helps ensure public safety each winter by allowing emergency vehicles and public transportation to move freely, and reducing hazardous conditions for motorists, pedestrians and other travelers. The ban is enforced on 107 miles of vital arterial streets from 3 a.m. to 7 a.m. starting Dec. 1st through April 1st, regardless of snow. Signage is permanently posted along

the affected routes.

Cars left parked on these designated roadways obstruct the path of snowplows and prevent routes from being fully plowed and salted when it snows. Violators of the parking ban will be towed and face a minimum \$150 towing fee, a \$60 ticket, and a storage fee of \$25 per day. Vehicles in violation of the ban will be towed to Pounds 2 (10301 S. Doty Ave.) or 6 (701 N. Sacramento).

A separate snow related parking ban exists for another 500 miles of main streets and can be activated after there are at least two inches of snow on the street, no matter the time of day or

The City's Winter the calendar date. While Overnight Parking Ban the 2" inch snow ban is the 2" inch snow ban is not activated often, motorists who are parked there when it snows could receive a ticket or find that their vehicle has been relocated in order to facilitate snow clearing operations.

Both of these parking bans were implemented on designated arterial streets to prevent recurrences of problems that happened in 1967 and 1979 when Chicago came to a traffic standstill due to major snowstorms.
