**City On Fire: Chicago 1871.** A rapidly growing city built of wood. A summer-long heat wave. An exhausted and misdirected team of firefighters. Racial, social and economic tensions bubbling just below the surface. All Chicago needed was a spark. Open until October 2024.

The Chicago History Museum, 1601 N. Clark st. is featuring "Back Home: Polish Chicago" that features more than 90 artifacts and documents as well as more than 100 reproduced photographs to help tell the story of the Chicago area's vibrant Polish communities from the mid-1800s to today. Explore personal narratives, music, community involvement, as well as art installations from five local Polish artists.

This exhibition is a collaborative project and oral

history initiative with the Polish History Museum (Warsaw, Poland), Polish Museum of America, and Loyola University Chicago Polish Studies program. Temporary exhibit through June 8, 2024.

Seek Funding For Revoked FOID Cards

Nearly three out of every four revoked FOID card holders have not accounted for their firearms or returned their FOID cards, according to a new report compiled by the Cook County Sheriff's Office.

Of the more than 39,000 people in Cook County who have their Firearm Owner's Identification card revoked, 68% (about 27,000) have not accounted for their guns or turned in their FOID cards as required by law.

A few jurisdictions in Cook County have been able to stay on top of the growing FOID revocations, but the vast majority have no personnel to do this work.

In Cook County, between April 1, 2022, and December 30, 2023, the backlog of 24,000 non-compliant FOID card holders increased to more than 27,000.

Among the most common reasons for FOID revocations are felony convictions, mental health concerns, and orders of protection.
