

CDOT Completes Bridge Projects



The Chicago Department of Transportation announced the completion of the reconstruction of two bridges on Halsted street between Division and Chicago avenues. The newly constructed "tied-arch" bridge (above) in the 1100 block of N. Halsted st. replaced an aging bascule movable bridge. The \$13.7 million project consisted of the removal of the old bridge, pavement and lighting. The new modern-design bridge is wider, with two travel lanes and a new bike lane in each direction. The bascule bridge on Halsted just north of Chicago ave. over the North Branch of the Chicago river received \$6.5 million rehabilitation project.

Bug Exhibit At Brookfield Zoo

Xtreme BUGS will be presented by Dominick's, at Brookfield Zoo through Sept. 7th. The exhibit will feature Xtra-large animatronic bugs, including a 16-foot-high by 33-foot-long Japanese hornet displayed in Roosevelt Fountain, to Xtra-small live insects as part of Harry's Big Adventure "My Bug World" presented by Terminix.

Zoogoers will be able to view more than 20 oversized animatronic bugs, from a fluttering monarch butterfly and ladybug to a praying mantis and a giant Madagascar hissing cockroach.

Kids will also have fun exploring, crawling, climbing, and sliding down the 10-foot by 20-foot spider web climber. Throughout the summer, guests can discover bugs' importance during Cultural Connections, featuring Zoo Chats, craft activities and special entertainment.

As guests exit Xtreme BUGS, they will encounter 5,000 harvester ants that live in the 8-foot-wide by 4-foot-high ant farm.

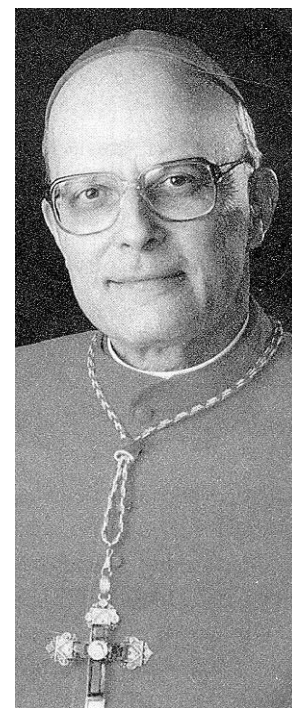
