



Students With Trauma

Wendy Lecker, a columnist for "The Hearst Connecticut" media group, who works for the Education Law Center, recently wrote that students need to cope with trauma. According to Lecker teachers in her district have seen a spike in the number of Kindergarten students entering school having suffered trauma. Most teachers she knows are not trained to meet these special needs. She also reports that the New York Council of School Superintendents has listed that its 2017 annual survey lists mental health issues as their number one priority.

The new catch word is "ACE" which stands for an adverse childhood experience. The number of children with ACE is growing across the board, especially Kindergarten.

Here are some of the things she and experts consider an ACE: Living with divorced or separated parent or guardian. Living with a parent or guardian who died or was incarcerated. Living with someone with a mental illness or substance abuse problem. Witnessing or being a victim of violence or abuse. Extreme economic hardship or neglect. Most of us know these are not ideal situations and know friends, neighbors and family members who are affected by one of these.

As a teacher, how can you tell some of the affects that may occur to your students? ACE affects brain development precisely in the area where learning occurs. Often a release of excess

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hormones are causing negative affects and the student has trouble maintaining or shifting from subjects. They could also have trouble calming down or being able to use a cognitive function. More than one half of these children with four ACEs displayed learning and behavior problems. Research states intervention in early years can help. Calm and nurturing adults appear to be a great way in helping the student. These children may not act well with sudden change, sensory overload and can often show signs of loneliness and rejection even when in a crowd.

Recently it was stated that 70% of children receiving mental health services receive them in school. The other 30% are from the parents with some coming from, sad to say, the legal system and prisons. It is sad but it seems that many who claim to be for children are more interested in the budget. You may have been watching Chicago Principals and Administrators Association in their fights for more Special Ed funding. You probably did not see the recent ruling in Connecticut that the judge calls mental health resources as extras and not necessary for education.

As a former educator and administrator, I can hardly think of a time I was not inundated by adults coming to let me know their child's secret. I warned them that DCFS made me a mandated reporter and some of what they told me I may have to let others know. Sometimes that ended the conversation, but most of the time it did not. I spent much time giving depositions, attending court hearings and such, I tried to let teachers know that I may be aware of situations I could not share.

The sooner I was brought into the loop, the sooner I could seek help. But it became hard to discipline those children who I was aware of certain problems. As far as the parents, it was hard not to be too judgmental. I had no way of completing longitudinal study of results, after all some had more ACE events that occurred that you could not keep track of. Sometimes I expected to see these kids on Maury or Springer or even Dr. Phil.

Teachers and other adults, help as you can but you are not (nor was I) Father Confessor. After all we cannot forgive sins, but hopefully, we can give these kids help.

Hate Crimes Law Is Strengthened

Illinois' stronger hate crimes law went into effect on Jan. 1st.

The legislation, House Bill 3711 (Public Act 100-0197) stemmed from a national increase in crimes motivated by hatred based on religion, race, national origin, gender identity and sexual orientation since the 2016 election.

The new law expands the list of crimes that can be prosecuted as hate crimes in an effort to address the increasing use of technology to attack victims.

The crimes of cyberstalking, transmission of obscene messages, and certain acts of intimidation can now be charged and prosecuted as hate crimes. Victims of hate crimes have the ability to file a civil lawsuit in response to these incidents and permits a judge to impose civil penalties on the perpetrator.

In 2016, Chicago Police Department data shows that hate crimes reached a five-year high. In early 2017, the Anti-Defamation League released a study showing an 85 percent increase in anti-Semitic incidents, including assaults, vandalism and harassment.

Anti-Semitic incidents at non-Jewish elementary, middle and high schools increased 106 percent, and a new anti-Semitic message is posted on social media every 83 seconds.

Task Force For Vehicle Terrorism

The Chicago City Council has heeded Alderman Edward M. Burke's call to form "a Chicago Vehicular Terrorism Task Force" to strategize ways to prevent terrorist attacks by large vehicles.

On December 13th aldermen unanimously approved a resolution calling for the formation of the task force just days after a terror attack involving a home-made pipe bomb that exploded in a New York transit tunnel near Times Square.

Burke suggested that authorities create a list similar to the Department of Homeland Security's "no-fly list" that would prevent such individuals from renting large vans or trucks.

The "Chicago Vehicular Terrorism Task Force" would be led by

the Chicago Police Department and include two appointees designated by the Mayor and the Chairmen of the City Council Committee on Pedestrian and Traffic Safety, Committee on Public Safety, Committee on Transportation and the Public Way, Committee on Budget and Government Operations, and Committee on Finance.

A designee of the Office of Emergency Management and Communications, and a designee of the Department of Transportation and Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events would be included.

The Task Force would consult with the Chicago Park District, Chicago Transit Authority, and any such other department or sister agency.

Registration For MyTax Illinois

Taxpayers wishing to participate in Illinois' income tax credit scholarship program, Invest in Kids, on Jan. 2nd are encouraged to register for a free MyTax Illinois account today.

The application process for taxpayers seeking to make a qualified contribution is only available online through MyTax Illinois. Completion of registration requires security authentication via mail, so applicants should allow 7-10 days to complete setup of their account.

Beginning Jan. 2nd, MyTax Illinois will begin accepting applications from individuals and businesses who wish to obtain an income tax credit equal to 75% of their approved contribution.

To apply, individuals and businesses must report their intention to make an authorized contribution to an approved Scholarship Granting Organization.

The SGOs, in turn, provide scholarships for eligible students to attend qualified non-public schools in Illinois. The application process ensures equal access to the \$75 million in tax credits available each year.
