happily ever after. Some alarming facts of suicide are that according to the Center for Disease Control (CDC) statistically only 1 in 50 suicides are successful. Most of

those that are unsuccessful never receive any help. Yes, whether you

realize it or not, you probably know someone who has attempted or seriously contemplated suicide. Some of you are unfortu-nate enough to know some poor souls who were successful in taking their own life. Think about it. If you

believe that you will know that people are remorseful and sorry about your demise, you about believe in an afterlife. If you believe in an afterlife, most believe suicide will take you to hell. Then do you really think you won?

Of course, there are many moral questions, especially mental conditions but if you know someone in this condition, seek help. Last year 44,193 Americans committed suicide. Most of them middle-aged white men. For the sake of your loved ones, if you think you know someone who is feeling like that, call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 1-800-273-TALK (8255). If you know anyone watching "13 Reasons Why", please stress with them that it is make believe. The characters are fictional and none of the events have ever happened.

Public Health Issues Swimming Alerts

"Swimming is not only a fun summer activity for kids of all ages, but it's also a great form of exercise that can help keep your heart healthy and lower your risk of obesity," said Illinois Department of Public Health Director Nirav D. Shah, M.D., J.D. "However, swimmers need to take an active role in helping pro-tect themselves and preventing the spread of germs. We all share the water we swim in, and we each need to do our part to help keep ourselves and our families and friends

This year's theme is, "Diarrhea and Swimming Don't Mix." Diarrheal incidents in recreational water can lead to outbreaks. Diarrhea is often caused by germs like Crypto (short for Cryptosporidium), Giardia, norovirus, Shigella, and E. coli O157:H7.

Just one diarrheal incident in the water can release enough germs, that if a person swallows a mouthful of water, it could cause diarrhea lasting up to 2-3 weeks.

Many people think chlorine will kill germs in the water instantly, but some germs can survive for days in properly chlorinated pools. Crypto can survive in an adequately chlorinated pool for more than one week and is the leading cause of disease outbreaks linked to swimming.

Other common recreational water illnesses include skin, respiratory, eye, neurologic, and wound infec-

and other natural bodies of water comes with a unique set of risks such as Naegleria fowleri, "the brain-eating ameba," and

harmful algal blooms. Naegleria fowleri is a microscopic ameba commonly found in warm freshwater lakes and rivers. If water containing the ameba goes up the nose, it can cause a rare, but devastating infection of the brain. To reduce your chances of becoming ill, limit the amount of water up your nose, avoid putting your head underwater, hold your nose or use nose clips, and avoid stirring up mud and scum while swimming in warm freshwater areas.

Algae can grow in warm freshwater areas and in large amounts can be harmful to people harmful algal blooms. You should stay out of water that contains harmful algal blooms. If you see that the beach is closed, stay out of it, and don't swim, water ski, or boat in areas where the water is discolored or where you see foam, scum, or mats of algae on the water's surface.

The wind picks up. Wildlife goes quiet. The temperature drops. The sunlight slowly dims in the middle of the day, bathing the surroundings in an eerie twilight. What feels like an otherworldly experience, is attainable on Earth, and it will leave you in awe. The Adler Planetarium's next temporary exhibit, Chasing Eclipses, will immerse you in the spine-tingling experience of a solar eclipse.

Dinos & Dragons At Brookfield Zoo



Through September 17th, guests of all ages can explore the new multisensory Dinos & Drag-ons exhibit at Brookfield Zoo, which re-creates a time when dinosaurs roamed the Earth and learning about dragon legends through culture and literature.

A display of 17 animatronic dinosaurs and dragons will feature Triceratops, Apatosaurus, Tyrannosaurus rex, and Chinese dragon.

Guests will first enter an indoor area in which they can explore the cultural connections between people and dragons through handson activities and up-close experiences with an amazing collection of large and small modern

dragons: lizards. Guests will see a 6foot Komodo dragon, frilled and bearded dragons, a European legless lizard, spiny-tailed lizard, iguanas, and a plumed basilisk, as well as several species of monitor lizards: the crocodile, roughneck, Nile, and black-throated. Youngsters can enjoy a variety of interactive activities, such as loading and releasing a miniature catapult, putting on a puppet show complete with a castle backdrop, and digging for realisticlooking dinosaur bones and other fossils. Kidfriendly stations will feature temporary tattoos, a dragon texture rubbing project, and fun photo opportunities. At dig boxes presented by JULIE, Inc., young paleontologists can uncover dinosaur arti-

Exiting the indoor area, guests will encounter graphics of inhabitants from the Late Jurassic Period, when the Stegosaurus North America 150 million years ago, to the Late Cretaceous Period of 85 million to 75 million years ago, when the Pteranodon wandered the Earth. Along a winding outdoor path landscaped with trees, each animatronic figure will come to life as guests pass by, triggering a sensor that signals body parts such as eyes, heads, arms, and tails to move.

Zoogoers can test their dinosaur and dragon knowledge by trying to answer questions from the "Games of Bones," which will feature paroPaleontologist?, and Dino Feud.

Guests will also encounter a replica of a paleontologist's excavation site and a dinosaur dissection lab, complete with a light box of x-rays, beakers, books, and a microscope. Staff will engage youngsters in "dissecting" realistic-looking dinosaur body parts made of non-latex materials.

Income Shares For Child Support

WA15-0576

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services announced that the widely used method nationwide to calculate child support will begin to be applied to new cases starting July 1st, following a bipartisan law signed by Governor Bruce Rauner last year.

Under the "income shares" model, child support will be calculated by looking at typical costs for families in similar circumstances. The income of both parents will also be factored in.

Currently, child sup-

port in Illinois is calculated based on the income of the obligor - the parent who owes payments and the number of children.

The income shares model considers the typical costs to raise a child for a family at a similar income level as the parents in a case. If there are two incomes, both are added together to arrive at the amount needed to raise the child. Each parent's contribution is then calculated by applying the methods laid out by the model. The portion owed by the parent who the child lives with is assumed to be paid because they reside together.

Among the costs of raising a child that are taken into account are housing, clothes, food. transportation, ordinary uncovered medical expenses, ordinary extracurricular activities, entertainment and education. Judges may also consider extraordinary circumstances in setting support.

The new guidelines will apply to all child support cases set beginning July 1, 2017, however, the change itself does not entitle a parent to a modification of any current order of support.

HFS oversees the child support collection process statewide, regularly managing around 500,000 cases annually. Child support services are free and anyone may apply. Applications for service can be found at www.illinois.gov/hfs

Policy Locator For Insurance

The Illinois Department of Insurance announced that families have now claimed more than \$4.6 million in insurance since July 1, 2016 using the free Life Policy Locator Service.

A potential beneficiary submits the necessary information including a copy of the death certificate to the Life Policy Locator Service on the DOI website. Then, DOI contacts 485 Illinois-licensed companies to search their records for any life insurance policies or annuity contracts insuring the

person who died. If a policy is found, that insurance company will contact the requestor if they are authorized to receive this information within 30 days to complete the claim process.

Opportunity Fund For Small Business

Mayor Rahm Emanuel announced that 32 initial businesses received investments from the Neighborhood Opportunity Fund which generfunding downtown development projects to support commercial growth on the south and west sides.

Approval criteria involve a proposal's ability to have a measureable, catalytic impact on a community or commercial corridor, based on the availability of similar goods or services and project feasibility, among other factors.

Eligible costs grants include property acquisition and rehabilitation, small business training, and local hiring subsidies. Up to 65 percent of total project costs are eligible for funding. Grants that exceed \$250,000 require City Grants Council approval. Project eligibility is limited to low-to-moderate income areas. The program is administered by the Department of Planning and Development.
