



Victims Should Be First Priority

Some of the news that has been on many programs has been about Hurricane Helene. Many of you have seen the obligatory shots of some announcers standing near the Gulf of Mexico as Hurricane Helene was getting closer. You can see the violent wind and later some channels gave us a view of the terrible storm itself and the devastation that occurred. Most felt sorry for the residents and loss of life.

The issue of many I spoke with was where are the rescue teams. It seemed that many reporters and some politicians wanted to talk about global warming. It might be what they were told to talk about. But I am happy to say that most of my conversations indicated a deep concern for those who have hopelessly survived the storm. Many of these people lived in the mountains and woods and we realize that many of them are resourceful. You can see the devastation was widespread. The people of these areas were busy checking on their neighbors as best they could. They had no phones, no cell service, electricity, clean water or proper sewage. Very few of them had high ground that they could go to for shelter.

Then as these rural Americans did they began helping each other including neighbors from nearby areas who started showing up with boats, tractors, chainsaws, fresh water and food. Some of these people had never met before, but they came.

As it became evident that the National Guard members were as bad off as they were. The

Pastors, and many churches came to help as they could. While no one on the news had found when search and rescue might come to their town. But doctors and nurses started to show up and build triage centers since most hospitals had no electricity and for many were impossible to reach. I heard citizens state that they did what they hope someday would come to them.

The Red Cross was there, as was Fox News, Catholic Charities, Samaritan's Purse, along with many church groups and Newsmax. It was noted they were grateful for this help and if these strangers could find them they wondered why FEMA had not.

There will be continuing stories, some that make no sense to us that feel life is more important than talking about it. When civilians started using their own drones to carry in supplies and water, they were told to stop. Others got their neighbors and relatives to use their own helicopters to bring in supplies and take out injured people. These reports were on several channels and newspapers. Of course, I could not independently verify these reports to be true, though they were reported by several stations. Some even stated that FEMA claimed to be broke. Many blame that on the money being spent on undocumented immigrants. While FEMA denied that report, it was in several papers over the last couple months. To be fair, FEMA also helps with forest fires and other emergencies.

Red Cross issued a statement asking people not to spread rumors that they haven't independently verified. But, of course, the people who needed to read these emails had no power or phones or cell service. So it is doubtful that many got this message. All emergencies are not this big. But you can help with donations and, of course, prayers. You can fact check everything in this article. It is on the internet. This article was written just to show things we do not see on most of our channels.

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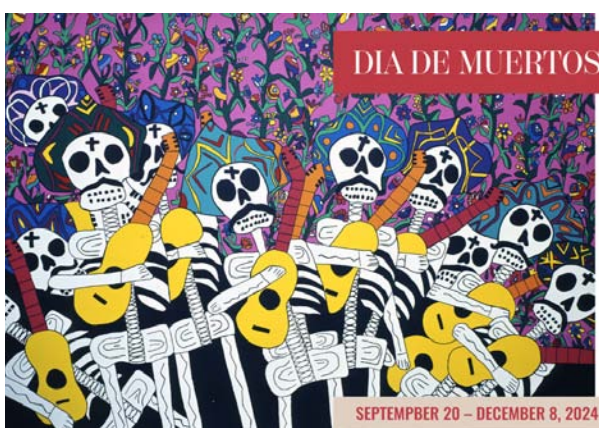
Court of Honor For Boy Scout Troop 1441

Mayor Launches Day In The Ward

Mayor Brandon Johnson has launched "A Day in the Ward," aimed at fostering collaboration between the City and neighborhoods. This initiative will showcase the City's investments in local communities, providing a platform for residents to connect with leaders and experience the resources available.

These engagements are designed to highlight efforts to improve public safety, youth programs and economic development and ensure communities are actively involved in shaping their future.

The program will feature a range of engagements, including: Conversations with local business owners about City resources, such as grants and small busi-

ness support. Roundtable discussions with faith leaders to address pressing issues. Collaborative forums with youth and violence prevention advocates.

Each activation is aimed at reducing and preventing violence, creating safe spaces for kids and families, connecting residents to mental and physical health resources, and sharing information about workforce development and job opportunities. The Johnson Administration will deploy infrastructure departments to complete repairs and maintenance, involving pothole repairs, street signs and crosswalk, street and alley lights, graffiti removal, cleaning vacant lots and trimming trees.

Fire Prevention Week Observance

Fire Prevention Week is Oct. 6th-12th, and the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services is promoting this year's campaign, "Smoke alarms: Make them work for you!"

In October 2019, DCSF launched a statewide program to provide free smoke alarms to families served by the department. To date, 6,135 smoke alarms have been distributed.

Illinois law requires every household to have smoke alarms within 15 feet of every bedroom and at least one on each floor of the home. Families may request smoke alarms from their caseworker or call their local field office to request one.

Food Coupons For Senior Citizens

The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program, administered jointly by the Illinois Department of Aging and Illinois Department of Human Services, offers income-eligible older adults access to up to \$50 worth of locally grown fruits, vegetables, herbs and honey from certified farmers.

Free coupon books, each containing five \$10 checks are distributed to more than 28,000 low-income older Illinoisans annually.

Eligible participants must be at least 60 years old and have a household income at or below 185% of the federal poverty level. For a single-person household, that amount is \$2,322 monthly. For a two-person senior household, the income threshold increases to \$3,151.

Checks can be used by Oct. 31st at participating farmers markets and roadside stands in 37 counties. SFMNP vendors display a yellow sign with black lettering indicating "farmers market nutrition program benefits accepted here."

Fall Features At Morton Arboretum

With the Chicago region experiencing an official moderate drought, the tree experts at The Morton Arboretum say it is still too early to tell how it will impact the timing and vibrancy of peak fall leaf color changes.

The region's lack of moisture triggered early fall color in some trees, including walnut, honey locust and other drought-sensitive species, such as certain birches. These trees have shown mostly yellow leaves, with some individual leaves already

shedding. Some trees and seedlings also have shriveled green leaves.

Trees that have already turned color and are losing leaves will likely continue to do so. Receiving more rain would help slow the process in trees that are partially turned or have yet to turn.

The Arboretum, which has tree collections containing nearly 4,100 species has a long fall-color season.

The Arboretum's annual Fall Color Festival, feature the Cider and Ale Festival through Oct. 14th; 14th Annual Glass Pumpkin Patch, Oct. 11th through 13th; Fall Color 5K Run and Walk, Oct. 26th; Walking Plays: "The Grimmest of Tales," weekends through Oct. 27th; and the Senorita Mariposa Story Walk, Oct. 31st.

Seasonal concessions will be available on weekends in October and Oct. 14th outside the Visitor Center, with apple cider doughnuts, taffy apples, cotton candy, warm kettle corn, warm pretzels, chili, craft beers and warm beverages.
