



## At Retreat For Clean Energy

DePaul University student Ph Tran was among 20 college students chosen to participate in a weeklong retreat in Mt. Hood, Oregon.

Tran, 20, was selected from more than 40 applicants because of her commitment to making renewable energy accessible to low-income communities.

Tran worked with Focus the Nation to bring students' voices into policies concerning a more sustainable future through her campus organization, the Roose-

velt Institute chapter at DePaul.

A sophomore majoring in political science and economics, she is originally from Da Lat, Vietnam, and moved with her family to Memphis, Tenn. in 2006.

She became the youngest member of Public Allies Chicago, an AmeriCorps program focused on leadership and community development.

In Chicago, Tran has worked in the Humboldt Park and Uptown neighborhoods.

The retreat students hiked Elliot Glacier, which has lost 60 percent of its snowpack since 1982; toured the Boardman Coal Plant, which is scheduled to close by 2020; visited the Dalles Dam, which has been producing hydro-power on the Columbia River since 1957; and visited Biglow Canyon Wind Farm, which powers 125,000 homes.

Students were chosen to represent four categories; innovators, technicians, politicians and storytellers. Tran was one of five students to represent politicians, who work to craft and advocate for a transformative clean energy public agenda.

## Author Gamble At Pritzker Library

Award-winning author Bruce Gamble is traveling across America in a vintage Ford Mustang to discuss his latest book while paying tribute to a literary giant 65 years ago, Jack Kerouac who embarked on a months-long journey of discovery across the United States and back - the basis of his classic novel *On the Road*.

Bruce will trace the entire 6,000-mile route in "Sweet Chariot," a 1967 Mustang convertible named for a bomber his father flew in World War II. Bruce will hold presentations and signings for his new book entitled *Swashbucklers and Black Sheep* at the Pritzker Military Library, 104 S. Michigan ave. on Thursday, Sept. 20th from 6 to 7:45 p.m.

The *Pictorial History of Marine Fighting Squadron 21 in World War II*, is an illustrated account of America's most famous fighter squadron. Initially calling themselves the Swashbucklers, the pilots of VMF-214 fought in the early battles of the Southwest Pacific campaign.

Later, under the leadership of Major Greg Boyington, the squadron became a household name as the Black Sheep.

The author is a retired Naval Flight Officer and former historian with the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation. A paralyzed veteran and cancer survivor, he has authored five nonfiction books on World War II and is a featured historian in documentaries produced by the History Channel, Fox News Channel, and PBS.

Bruce has driven his classic convertible, fitted

with hand controls and other improvements, over more than 30,000 miles.

Szykowny Funeral Home director and owner Jonathan Siedlecki, a trustee of the Boys and Girls Club, joined scores of community and civic leaders, educators, donors, Club alumni and fellow members of the Union League Club of Chicago for the ribbon cutting ceremony of the Union League Boys and Girls Club One.

Mayor Rahm Emanuel cut the ribbon on 17,000-square-foot addition located in the Pilsen neighborhood. The late 19th century Chicago building that has been "a beacon of light and a refuge" for thousands of members of the Union League Boys and Girls Club for 92 years, has a bright future thanks to the restoration. Mr. Siedlecki swam in the club pool once a week as a boy.

The property, formerly a bordello, was bought by Union League in 1919 and converted into what was then became a Boys Club. Now, the Union League's three such clubs serve 1,000 boys and girls each year, with dramatic success, as indicated by a 95% high school graduation rate and a 0% rate of criminal convictions.

The newly remodeled Club One, which remained open during construction, features a full size gym upstairs and

a kids' activity area downstairs. Another gym is being constructed and will be brought online soon.
