




Celebration At Yorktown, VA

What locations would you think are the most requested US destination vacation brochures? A travel magazine stated that some agencies in South America, Asia and Europe listed the top three, and yes Orlando and New York were numbers one and two but the third was not Chicago, Vegas or LA, but the historical triangle in Virginia.

Most reading this would have no idea where this triangle is. It's about an 850 mile drive to the East. The triangle is composed of Jamestown, Williamsburg and Yorktown, Virginia. Why do I bring this up? This Friday we celebrate the traditional end of the American Revolution. Historians will tell you that it is an over simplification, but on October 19, 1781 Cornwallis surrendered a large portion of the British Army to George Washington whose Army consisted of Continentals, militia and French allies at Surrender Field in Yorktown, VA.

rendered after a nine day siege. Washington and the allies had surrounded them and they had no way to retreat. It was the last major battle of the six and a half year military conflict. The war did win independence from the British Empire.

Very little is mentioned about this in our classrooms. It was an epic struggle. It was between everyone now considered Americans: colonists, white and black, slaves and former slaves, indentured servants, recent immigrants, and many tribes of Native Americans. These individuals fought on both sides for as many reasons that you can think of. This is an excellent assignment for some classes depending on their ability on how particular groups chose sides.

The Historic triangle will be a very active area October 19th, 20th and 21st. The Battle of Yorktown will be reenacted by thousands of reenactors. There will be historical lectures, demonstrations of life in the 1700s, Army encampments, and an inter-tribal pow wow among the many activities.

It is a great place to learn history. My family and I have been there several times. We felt it was well worth it. We recall standing the field, you think you are alone, then you move 20 feet and you can see thousands of reenactors in the trenches. It helps you realize how brave these people were. The children need to see what people did for their freedom. It even set in motion the end of slavery. It is amazing how so many around the world know about this historic triangle and consider visiting it when many of our neighbors have never heard of it.

Health Care Insurance Rates

The Illinois Department of Insurance (DOI) released its on-Exchange health care rate and plan analysis for Plan Year 2019, showing that rates have stabilized for the first time in recent years.

Average rates for the 2019 lowest cost silver plans decreased four percent and the lowest cost gold plans decreased by six percent from last year. Overall, rates for the lowest cost bronze plans modestly increased approximately six percent, far less than the 20 percent increase reported for 2018 rates.

Illinois consumers in all counties will have options to purchase health insurance coverage on the Exchange.

Individuals and small businesses can purchase their health insurance on the GCI website. Because GCI facilitates the federal subsidies, consumers are able to see their monthly premium at the discounted price.

DOI is advising consumers enrolling or re-enrolling in coverage to start shopping early, due to the six week enrollment period set by the federal government, and to look at all options available to them on and off the Exchange, from November 1, 2018 to December 15, 2018.


Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis through the 311 system at the beginning of each year.

The cost per square foot charged to property

owners is well below what a private contractor would charge. Senior citizens and persons with disabilities may qualify to receive a 50 percent discount. The cost to a property owner of an average mid-block property generally ranges from \$800 to \$1,500.

CDOT engineers conduct sidewalk condition surveys, calculate the proposed cost and send an invoice to the property owner. Property owners then have 45 days to accept the proposed cost and agree to participate.

Penguin Birth At Shedd Aquarium



Shedd Aquarium announced that the first Magellanic penguin chick (*Spheniscus magellanicus*) bred at the aquarium, which hatched on Mother's Day weekend, is a female. A contest for staff to choose her name resulted in Nia (NEE-ah).

The name is derived from Patagonia, a region located at the southern end of South America where the species is native.

Shedd is home to two species of penguins, Magellanic and rockhopper (*Eudyptes chrysocome*). The aquarium's rockhopper population is much older and has been prolific in producing and rearing chicks most recently Diego in 2015 and Ruggles in 2013. The aquarium's Magellanic penguins are much younger.

Lana Vanagasem, manager of penguins and otters said "While our Magellanic are maturing and beginning to pair off and breed, some of our rockhoppers are living to ages we've never seen before."

Guests at the aquarium can still point Nia out by her feathers, which are not quite as

dark yet as the adult Magellanic in Shedd's Polar Play Zone habitat.


