Koalas At Brookfield Zoo

Brumby and Willum, two male koalas, arrived at Brookfield Zoo Chicago on June 10th and have been acclimating to their new home at the Hamill Family Play Zoo. Now, the marsupials are ready

to meet the public.
The koalas, are here through a loan partnership with San Diego Zoo Wildlife Alliance and San Diego Zoo's Koala Educa-tion and Conservation

Project.

Koalas, who prefer a solitary lifestyle, live in eucalypt forests, which are their home, shelter, and food source. They eat eucalyptus leaves, which are highly poisonous to most other animals. They have two types of teeth to help them eat the leaves—incisors at the front of their mouths, strip leaves off branches and their molars help cut and grind the leaves to make them more digestible.

Because of the leaves'

high level of toxicity, koalas have specialized gut bacteria that breaks down the poisonous leaves, extracting all water and nutrients. This is why koalas spend most of their time—up to 18-22 hours a day—sleeping in trees conserving their en-

Although many refer to koalas as bears, there is no relation.

Those interested in supporting the care of the koalas can contribute to the Animal Adoption program. For \$35, a recipient receives a personalized certificate of adoption, a 5-inch x 7-inch color photograph, a fact sheet on species, program decal, and invitation to the Adoption summer event.
