The American Legion Central Park Post #1028 membership includes 20 WWII Veterans. This is the fifth of a group of features highlighting these veterans. It is part of the Post's Patriotism Awareness Program to Preserve American Heritage.

Bernie Kash 91, spent his childhood in Bridgeport, is a lifelong resident of the southside of Chicago and graduated from Lindblom High School in 1942. He was drafted into the U.S. Army that same year and completed basic training in Atlantic City, New Jersey.

While assigned to the signal corps, his advanced individual training was completed at Fort Monmouth, specializing in radar communication.

Along with the 1016 signal company, he shipped out to North Africa, landing in Casablanca and participated in Desert Battles in Algeria and Tunisia.

By May of 1943, North Africa became a stepping-off point for the invasion of Sicily and mainland Italy. Together, operation Torch and the North African Campaign cost the allies 76,000 casualties killed or wounded.

Over 238,000 prisoners of war were taken. Kash than traveled by troop ship to the east coast of Sicily and by the end of July, 1943 Benito Mussolini was removed from power. German

Public Meeting on School Budget Cuts



Over 500 residents attended a public meeting at Shields Elementary School, 43rd & Rockwell on July 17th which was organized by the Brighton Park Neighborhood Council regarding the budget cuts that were proposed by Chicago Public Schools. Several elected officials were present, including State Senator Martin Sandoval, Cook County Commissioner Jesus Garcia, Alderman Toni Foulkes, and two representatives from CPS, Family and Community Engagement representative Phil Hampton and the Pershing Network vice-president Julio Contreras. Sen. Sandoval presented a \$210,000 check to the Kelly Park Advisory Committee for restoration efforts.

In addition to the \$4 million dollars cut at Kelly High School, \$1 million will be cut from Davis Elementary, \$500 thousand from Burroughs and Columbia Explorer Academy, \$300 thousand from Shields Middle School, \$200 thousand from Shields Elementary, and \$100 thousand from Gunsualus Academy. Budget cuts amongst all schools in the Brighton Park area are projected to be over \$7.5 million, meaning a loss of over 40 teachers. The presenters also discussed charter schools being built in the area and construction projects such as the DePaul basketball stadium, noting how these projects would take millions of dollars in taxpayer money.

Blanding's Turtles At Brookfield Zoo



Blanding's turtles are endangered in Illinois and threatened nationwide, but the Chicago Zoological Society, in collaboration with the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County, is leading an initiative to increase the local wild population. The Society, which manages Brookfield Zoo, has created a breeding and release program that includes a new outdoor turtle habitat at the Dragonfly Marsh exhibit. The program will allow staff to develop and improve breeding and rearing techniques that will increase the number of turtles available for release. Later this fall, 12 turtles will be released in DuPage County forest preserves to help bolster the wild population.

Blanding's turtles in the wild have an approximate 2 percent chance of reaching maturity due to predators like raccoons and herons.
