



## The Passing of a President An Educational Opportunity

The recent events in Washington, DC gave the people an opportunity to pay respects to Bush 41 and the presidency in general. Parents once again had an opportunity to educate their children on what is good and decent about the American people.

I was in Washington on a previously scheduled meeting with legislators, but I took time to pay respects at the rotunda along with another AMAC delegate who was from Dallas. To give an idea of how many different people you meet in the line, it wrapped from the Supreme Court Building, passed the Library of Congress and through the Capitol grounds and visitors' center, under the Capitol Building and then to the Rotunda. Then after viewing the casket, you had an opportunity to sign the guest book, which we did.

Because people wrapped in various length of lines and people got out to stop and photograph and a few times some of us took elevators, the people you are walking with was constantly changing. It was a great opportunity despite the cold, windy weather to meet people you would never otherwise had talked with. Everyone was polite and talkative -- until we went inside when things became somber.

Very few of the people we had an opportunity to converse with were old enough to have voted for or against #41 in 1988. Yes most people forgot he was not reelected in 1992. It was a one term presidency. Historically you might remember that that is when Ross Perot changed history and Bill Clinton was elected. Early in his term, President Bush had some of the highest approval ratings ever recorded as he led a coalition to liber-

ate Kuwait, but the economy caused him in a short time to have one of the lowest ratings ever. But those in line weren't able to remember this, but they did know that since he had left the White House and returned to civilian life he no longer sought the limelight or to feel important. It was commonly coming up in conversations that this civil man was a great example that they wished some of the other past Presidents would adhere to. One family from Philadelphia told his young one he was embarrassed that he had voted for Ross Perot.

We met a group of parents with children in strollers talking about trying to instill respect for the presidency even though some of them admitted they voted against him. A group from a school tour from a girls' high school in Georgia were complaining how the recent elections in their state did not allow any divergence of opinion. They could not find one local candidate that was not pro-choice and they personally found partial birth abortion as not right. They believed in the time of 41 he would have understood. We met several veterans from Desert Storm who were proud to have served.

Before our section of the line got inside I was interviewed by Voice of America -- Turkey. I am sure it would not air because they wanted me to say something about President Trump. I felt that would be in bad taste, because that was not why we were here. When they asked me the difference between the two I said simply one is alive, the reporters walked away. Some young ladies from Florida and New Hampshire came with us much of the way. They thanked me for not giving the reporters anything to show controversy.

The young children that were near us had been prepped well by their families. They were respectful and many of them were overcome by the solemnity and had tears. When I got to the viewing area I too was somewhat emotional. I saluted and made the Sign of the Cross and when I turned around many of these youngsters noting what I did, did the same.

After leaving the Rotunda I met a group of ladies with strollers and children who like us were there to see legislators, but they were seeking funding for research for childhood cancers. Despite their problems (each had lost at least one child to cancer) they found the three hours in line an opportunity to teach their surviving children that this is what we do. We mourn for each other and understand others have it worse than we do.

## 2019 Property Tax Bills Now Online


In response to a high volume of requests by taxpayers, accountants and tax advisors, Cook County Treasurer Maria Pappas has posted next year's First Installment property tax bill to cookcountytreasurer.com, nearly three months before the due date.

Property owners should consult with a tax professional about income tax deductions for 2018.

Tax Year 2018 First Installment taxes, due March 1, 2019, are 55 percent of the prior year's total tax.

You may look up your tax bill on cookcountytreasurer.com by using your address or 14-digit Property Index Number (PIN). Here's how to pay: Go to cookcountytreasurer.com and select "Make an Online Payment"; download and print your bill from the website and either: mail it to the treasurer's Office, or pay in person at a Chase bank branch or the Treasurer's Office.

Community organization award will recognize collaborative partnerships between schools and community organizations to empower student voice and civic engagement.


Applications, criteria, and information on eligibility will be available in January.

State Rep. Theresa Mah was selected to be among six Asian American state legislators who traveled to Japan as part of the 2018 Asian American Leader-

ship Delegation Program Nov. 30th to Dec. 8th. The Delegation visited Tokyo, Kyoto and Osaka to meet with Japanese political and government leaders, business executives, and nonprofit leaders.
