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Supreme Court Rules On Colorado

The legal issues concerning some of the states vs. President Trump has become a very interesting situation. Some of the legal groups like Judicial Watch and Thomas More Society were happy to announce that the recent Supreme Court ruling will prevent certain groups from filing that President Trump cannot be a candidate due to the

Court ruled that Colorado
had no legal right to use insurrection as a charge to prevent an election or to challenge its results. While some elected officials have been on different sides of the issue, the court ruled that it could not use the issue because it could be used in so many ways.

The Senate Majority leader, Chuck Schummer, called for harm to be done vs new Supreme Court Justice Cavanaugh and shortly after this, they arrested a man for threatening him. Also, Bernie Sanders used volatile language to excite the crowd and four days later one of his supporters opened fire on the Republican Congressional baseball practice, wounding four including Representative Scalise.

These are all issues that can be used if the insurrection charges could be utilized. You can look these things up as I did and there are many other situations that have led us to some of these unsettling times.

Training Program For Police Recruits



Cook County Sheriff Thomas J. Dart has relaunched Seniors Training Academy Recruits to Succeed, a unique program where older adult volunteers help train police recruit to better serve the community.

Sheriff Dart founded the STARS program in 2017 to hone recruits' communication skills and prepare them to navigate real-life scenarios effectively as police officers. In this training, each recruit receives a radio call for service, stating that a senior has been a victim of a crime. The recruit responds and engages with the senior portraying the victim. Following the exercise, recruits receive feedback on their interactions.

This unique approach provides invaluable scenario-based training that enhances a recruit's communication skills, teaching them how to better connect with a large segment of the community who are often victims of

"The innovative program, which is a joint venture with Triton College's Retired Senior Volunteer Program, offers a unique way to prepare our recruits for serving and protecting

our community," Sheriff Dart said. "We now can better equip our recruits to communicate effectively and enhance public safety. We are grateful for the support we have received and look forward to continuing this training for years to come."

The program was put on hold due to the COVID-19 pandemic and relaunched May 2024. This training helps recruits take the important lessons learned in the Training Academy and apply them when interviewing role-playing seniors who have been trained to portray vitims

of senior-specific crimes.

This June, a new exhibit, Akito Tsuda: Pilsen Days will open on the 9th floor of the Harold Washington Library Center, 400 S. State st. Featuring work by Japanese photographer Akito Tsuda, Pilsen Days highlights the unique spirit and daily life of the neighborhood in the 1990s.

Tsuda arrived from Japan in 1988 at the age of 21 and enrolled at Columbia College Chicago in 1990. On a class photography assignment, he encountered Pilsen, a primarily Mexican American neighborhood and found himself readily accepted. Despite knowing only some English and no Spanish, he photographed over 500 striking images over the next four years.

After graduation, he returned to Japan in 1994 and kept his Pilsen images in storage for 20

In 2014, wanting to re-connect with the people of Pilsen, selected images were posted on Facebook and Instagram, where the positive response was immediate. Excited viewers identified family members, friends and other subjects of the photos and shared stories about the shared stories about the experience of being photographed as well as the lives of the people in the

images.
Through the support of several local community centers and cultural institutions, Tsuda has traveled back to Chicago multiple times to meet with residents and share his work. Chicago Public Library's Archives and Special Collections divi-sion acquired 118 photo-graphs in 2021 and added them to its archieves, making the work available. Visit hwlc@chipub-

Expanded Access For SSI Program

The Social Security Administration recently published a final rule, "Expand the Definition of a Public Assistance Household." This final rule announces one of several updates to Supplemental Security Income regulations that will help people receiving and applying. SSI provides monthly payments to adults and children with a

disability or blindness, and to adults aged 65 and older. These benefits help pay for basic needs like rent, food, clothing, and medicine. Applicants must meet eligibility requirements, including income and resource limits.

Under the final rule, beginning Sept. 30th, the agency will expand the definition of a public assistance household to insulate the september of the september o clude households receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program payments and households where not all members receive public assistance. The expanded definition will allow more people to qualify for SSI, increase some recipients payment amounts, and reduce reporting burdens for individuals living in public assistance house-

The revised rule also changes the definition of a public assistance house-

hold when determining who in a household receives public assistance. The new rule defines a public assistance household as one that has both an SSI applicant or recipient, and at least one other household member who receives one or more of the listed means-tested public income-maintenance payments (the any other definition).

The previous policy required all household members to receive public assistance. This change benefits SSI recipients living in households where only some members receive public assistance. SNAP is the first PIM

benefit added to the agency's public assistance household definition since it was established in 1980.

These changes are key because, if an applicant or recipient is determined to be living in a public assistance household, the agency assumes they are not receiving assistance from other household members that would otherwise be counted as income. This will allow more people to qualify for SSI and in some cases, receive a higher payment.
