Of those that were returned, the survey indicated they were most interested in A) Location, is it easy to get to on the way to work; B) is there bus service available; C) the length of day, are there extra programs before and after school; D) is parking available for parents to visit during the day; and E) the universities that the staff attended.

No matter what the answer, none of these would have made us a good school. Convenient, maybe, fitting the needs of families, possibly, but the quality of our product was never considered -- of course, some may have figured that a well known university meant a great staff. It does not. Sometimes it means staff members' families had money, or they tested well. But by experience, some of the most "intelligent" on paper were the worst teachers, as many of them were unable to understand why the students didn't "get it".

Some of the other things people look at to determine a "good" school that often mean nothing A) Honor Roll list, if you see this on the wall and goes on forever, it probably means nothing; B) Racial composition of the school, there are great and terrible schools in all groups, of course, you don't want your child to be "the only one"; C) test scores, very common, but many of these kids will be successful at any school, for various reasons; D) attendance rate, I've seen no studies that indicate this matters; E) winning sports teams, maybe it involves pride, but does it make the school good?; F) area contest winners,

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these kids will probably win regardless of their school, when a study goes back to these kids, they are usually the ones who had the highest entrance exam scores anyway; and G) websites, no matter how pretty the website is, it does not make a difference.

So what is significant to help you figure out a good school? A) is the curriculum set with the appropriate age by state standards; B) is the school safe in and out, yet allows for parents to be able to visit; C) cleanliness of the school, regardless of the buildings' age; D) bulletin boards, are students prominent, is Honor Roll a fair amount and not the whole school; and E) staff experience, is there a large turn over in staff, this may not be easy to find, but indicates a stable environment.

It is obvious that this is my opinion and you might think of others. However, I believe this is fair and a good way to help you search. Just because a school has a reputation, does not mean it is any better than a local school that deals with everyone, not just the elite kids.

Brookfield Zoo will celebrate its annual Party for the Planet on Sunday, April 22nd, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The day of fun-filled environmentally-friendly activities, feature animal Zoo Chats, recycling and planting opportunities, and an Eco Expo.

At 11 a.m., zoogoers can join the grounds staff in planting a tree on the south mall. Between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. zoogoers can assist in planting pansies in containers outside Hamill Family Play Zoo. An oak sapling and acorn seeds (while supplies last) will be available to take home and plant. The zoo, which features more than 100 species of trees, recently had its arboretum status renewed. Schrantz Receives Fellowship Award

World Penguin Day At Brookfield Zoo



Brookfield Zoo will stage its World Penguin Day celebration on Saturday, April 21st. Activities for the entire family will be taking place between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., inside and outside The Living Coast exhibit.

The first 1,000 youngsters will receive a commemorative World Penguin Day wristband. The bands are the same colors as those on the zoo's penguins, and are how the animal care staff identify each individual bird. Kids can check out the ID guide posted in The Living Coast's Rocky Shores' habitat to determine which penguin is wearing the same color band as theirs.

Zoogoers can meet a few of the resident penguin "artists" outdoors at 12:30 and 2:30 p.m. on Saturday (weather permitting). The pieces of art are created with nontoxic watercolors. On the back of each canvas is a photo of the "artist" and footprint signature.

A pack of five notecards featuring images of the paintings will be available with a minimum \$10 donation. Proceeds will go towards the Chicago Zoological Society's Animal Care and Conservation Fund to help support its efforts in the Punta San Juan program. Located along South America's west coastline in Peru, Punta San Juan is a reserve where research and community outreach is being conducted to help protect the species native to the region, including Humboldt penguins.

Guests can attend Zoo

Chats and observe the penguins being fed in their habitat at 10:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. During the informal talks, animal care staff will share stories about the zoo's colony of Humboldt penguins along with conservation efforts that are being done to help protect these charismatic animals. At noon and 1:30 p.m., staff will provide the birds with enrichment items and answer any questions from the public.

The zoo's volunteer educators, will be at an information station with penguin artifacts. Volunteers will engage guests of all ages in the "egg shuffle" activity. Those who have wondered what it is like to be a penguin parent can try walking while balancing a replica egg on top of their feet. This demonstrates how several species of penguins protect their eggs.

A 6-foot-tall penguin sculpture made of plastic trash will remind everyone about the negative impact plastic waste pollution has on ocean life. Zoogoers can help keep these majestic birds safe with daily practices, including recycling plastic garbage and using reusable bags at grocery stores. Individuals can also download the Monterey Bay Aquarium's Seafood Watch Consumer Guide at seafoodwatch.org that suggests choices based on responsible fishing practices.

Those interested in helping care for the Humboldt penguins at Brookfield Zoo can contribute to the Share the Care program. For \$35, the recipient will receive the Basic Package, which includes a 5-inch x 7-inch color photograph of a penguin, a personalized adoption certificate, a fact sheet about the species, a Share the Care car decal, and an invitation to the 2018 Share the Care Evening. City Promotes Opportunity Fund

The City Council will consider a measure that would authorize an additional \$6 million in funding for the Neighborhood Opportunity Fund, which generates funds from downtown development projects to support commercial corridor growth on the South, Southwest and West sides.

The inaugural class of Fund winners was announced in June 2017, in which \$3.2 million was awarded to 32 businesses, selected from among more than 700 applications. The second round awarded \$3.2 million to 25 businesses, selected from more than 800 applicants.

The Neighborhood Opportunity Fund, is financed by voluntary contributions from downtown construction projects. The payments are in exchange for density bonuses that allow developers to exceed zoning limits for a specific development site.

Eligible costs for grants include property acquisition and rehabilitation, small business training and local hiring subsidies. Up to 65 percent of a small business' eligible project costs can be covered through the program. Grants that exceed \$250,000 require City Council approval. The program is administered by the Department of Planning and Development. A complete list of projects and more information is available at www.neighborhoodopportunityfund.com.

Mummy Exhibit At Field Museum



The Field Museum is conducting an exhibition of Mummies from ancient Egypt and Peru through Sunday, April 21st from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Comprised of objects from The Field's own collection, the exhibition includes 14 mummies, exquisitely painted coffins, stone sarcophagus fragments, ceramics, mummified animals, and tummy masks. Using non-invasive CT scanning, DNA analysis, and other cutting-edge technologies, museum scientists pare back thousands of years and reveal the people behind gilded coffins. Scans of the intricately wrapped "Gilded Lady" mummy of ancient Egypt reveal details that show us what she looked like.

Visitors will also be able to virtually explore the contents of never-opened Peruvian mummy bundles to discover the individuals within: children, mothers, and the objects their families buried with them.

CZS Mourns Loss Of Gorilla Ramar

The Chicago Zoological Society announces the loss of Ramar, a 50-year-old western lowland gorilla on April 12th. A few weeks ago animal care staff reported that he was not eating. Veterinary staff performed a complete evaluation, including a CT scan, ultrasound, and endoscopy. During the exam, it was revealed that Ramar had a partial blockage of his bowel and stomach with plant material from his normal diet. He was experiencing diminished bowel function, which is a common challenge in geriatric patients. Veterinary and animal care staff were able to help manage Ramar through this concern. However, during his recovery, his overall comfort became a major consideration. Based on his quality of life, staff came to the difficult conclusion that euthanasia was the most humane decision.

Ramar outlived the median life expectancy for male gorillas in the accredited North American zoo population, which is 32 years. As he grew older, similar to humans that live to advanced ages, he was afflicted with a number of geriatric ailments, including degenerative heart disease and arthritis. At age 50, Ramar was the oldest animal at Brookfield Zoo and the sixth oldest western lowland gorilla (he was the second oldest male) in the North American accredited zoo population. He had quite a unique background. In 1969, after being orphaned in the wild, he was brought to the United States and raised by a human family until he was about 6 years old. Ramar was then acquired by North Carolina Zoo in 1974, and spent some time at Philadelphia Zoo and Zoo Miami. He arrived at Brookfield Zoo in October 1998 on a breeding loan and quickly became a favorite among guests and staff. For 13 years, he was the zoo's dominant male gorilla (known as a silverback). While at Brookfield, he sired his only three offspring—a son (Nadaya) with Baraka in 2001, a daughter (Kamba) with Koola in 2004, and another son (Bakari) with Binti Jua in 2005. Ramar's longevity at tests to the excellent professional care he received at Brookfield Zoo. He even participated in his own healthcare. Animal care staff had taught him a wide behavioral repertoire that included accepting hand injections and presenting various body parts (shoulder, arm, hand, foot, open mouth, etc.) for treatment that assisted zoo veterinary staff in providing the highest quality of care to him. Just last June, CZS's veterinary team were joined by a board-certified veterinary dentist and orthopedic surgeon to assist with two procedures. One addressed Ramar's receding gums. The other involved performing an arthroscopic examination of his knees that resulted in Ramar receiving injections of a synthetic joint lubricant and platelet rich plasma, both of which are shown to improve comfort.
