They are not racist because you said they are. All of our area elected officials told us and declared their support for the title Sanctuary City. So at the very least, regardless of how or if you voted, we're all in this together and no matter how close to our community you live, you will at least pay your taxes. It doesn't matter if it's state or city or federal, don't let them double talk you, we are all paying for it.

I hope you consider that everyone who stopped to read this article cares. We may show it in different ways, due to our upbringing and family history. My family has a long history of immigrants. The first we found was in the 1630s and the

latest was in the 1980s. Personally, I'm glad for their sacrifices.

Some of our neighbors are worried about locations of where the migrants will be located. Whether it is close to you or not, it will affect you. New immigrants will probably not stay in the tent city 24/7. They will be all over the area, attending our schools and churches. Truth about it, you have no idea what group of these people you will meet. There are huge numbers of Africans, Asians, Latin Americans, and South Americans. Most people I talked with are assuming the new group that will be coming to our area will speak Spanish. This is not necessarily true. Just like the new people will probably not be drug dealers or in cartels though some people have this fear.

We have no idea what the courts could come up with. Can the government set up segregated facilities? Have we the right to have them stay behind fences and any other number of things. Some of our neighbors are worried because they have had no say in the matter. Yet others have been complaining for months that the government has no plan. I know many of our school parents are worried because we have no records of vaccinations for the vast majority. People worry about new outbreaks that almost never exist in our community, measles, smallpox, polio, etc. Our parents who have been diligent getting their children vaccinated have been able to receive shots for most of these diseases. Take care of your families the best you can.

Application For Energy Assistance

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity encouraged eligible families to apply for the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program to support with utility bill assistance for natural gas, propane, and electricity. Applications are open for income-eligible households with seniors age 60+, Illinoisans with a documented long-term disability, and/or children under age 6.

Eligible families can apply by visiting helpillinoisfamilies.com or by calling 1-833-711-0374 for assistance.

All families who meet the qualifications and provide proper documentation will receive sup-

port until funding is exhausted. Families who earn up to 200% the federal poverty level, have a household with a senior, a child or children under 6, and/or a person with a disability, are eligible to receive support through LIHEAP.

Additional eligible households will be able to apply for assistance on Nov. 1st and Dec. 1st, and applications will be accepted through August 15, 2024, or until funds are exhausted. The energy bill assistance program offered through the Help Illinois Families Program in program year 2024 will provide \$237 million to eligible families for energy bill assistance.

Health Benefits For Immigrants

The Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services announced that as the Health Benefits for Immigrant Seniors program nears 16,500 individuals, a temporary pause on new enrollees will take effect Nov. 6th.

The program provides Medicaid-like health care coverage to individuals aged 65 and older who would be eligible for Medicaid but for their immigration status, which launched in late 2020. The Department also operates the Health Benefits for Immigrant Adults program (HBIA), which provides similar coverage for individuals aged 42 to 64. Through the end of September, nearly 69,000 individuals are covered across the HBIA and HBIS programs.

HFS announced in

June that new HBIS enrollment would be capped at 16,500 individuals, when the Department filed emergency and regular rules outlining a range of HBIA and HBIS program changes the state has implemented to bring program costs within the amount the General Assembly budgeted for State Fiscal Year 2024, which began July 1st.

Compared with the traditional Medicaid population, month enrollment has grown at a higher rate, and per-enrollee costs have tracked higher among the HBIA and HBIS-enrolled populations due to more prevalent, untreated chronic conditions and higher hospital costs, pushing the limit of the funds made available for these programs for the current fiscal year.

County Abolishes Medical Debt

Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle announced the Medical Debt Relief Initiative has successfully acquired and abolished \$281.3 million in medical debt to benefit 158,541 residents since the program launched in 2022.

Eligible patients will have debt erased without taking any action. Recipients are notified by mail that their debts have been relieved, and any negative marks on their credit reports associated with this debt are removed.

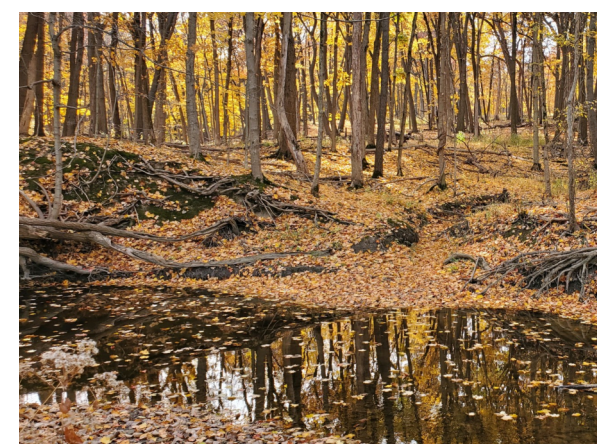
These events are hosted and planned by a group of 15 youth employees who curate these events, focusing on engaging other youth and families in their commu-

Fall Color In Forest Preserves



Fall foliage is set to peak in October this year, and the Forest Preserves of Cook County can help visitors find the closest fall color hot spot via a new interactive web map feature.

In the first update, the interactive web map, found at map.fpdcc.com, compiled a list of spots most likely to feature dramatic fall color.

Created in 2021, the interactive web map helps users locate hundreds of Forest Preserves locations, trails, amenities and activities available throughout 70,000 acres of natural public land. The new Fall Color activity filter joins 28 other searchable activities, many of which are free to participants, from fishing, biking, Nature Centers, picnic spots, canoeing to birding.
