CDA To Acquire Midway Armory

The Chicago Department of Aviation would enter negotiations to acquire the former Illinois Ārmy National Guard Midway Armory, 5400 W. 63rd st. from the State of Illinois and utilize the facility for operational purposes Midway İnternational Airport under an ordinance introduced to City Council on April 19th.

The four-acre property is adjacent to the southwestern boundary of the Midway airfield. The 75,000-square-foot structure has remained vacant since 2017, when the unit relocated to Kankakee.

The purchase would be financed strictly by airport funds, without the use of any local taxpayer

The structure would be utilized for operational purposes, including interior storage of snow removal equipment. CDA control also ensures the property's uses are compatible with airport operations, since a portion lies within the federally regulated Runway Protection Zone for Midway Runway 4R/22L.

Application For Rental Assistance


