\$5 Million For Midway Airport

Congressman Dan Lipinski announced that the U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Aviation Administration has awarded a \$5.1 million grant for the reconstruction of two airplane taxiways at Midway Airport. Both taxiways have reached the end of their useful life.

The grant is through the FAA's Airport Improvement Program, which provides funding for projects that improve the safety and efficiency of airports in the National

Plan of Integrated Airport Systems.

Rep. Lipinski is the state's most senior member on the House Transportation & Infrastructure Committee and sits on the Aviation Subcommittee.

He helped to secure \$30 million from the FAA for the installation of arrester beds in Midway's runway safety areas to stop aircraft from overshooting the airfield. Earlier this year, the congressman successfully fought to block plans for the overnight closure of the airport's control tower due to federal sequestration.
