This week, as I was preparing to write this article, I was doing research into the Cartel using Indian reservations to move fentanyl and methamphetamines through central Arizona. But I was interrupted by a phone call. That's how I was informed about the incident in Butler, PA. Its simple message changed everything. You can smuggle drugs all you want to, if no one on the other side is stupid enough to buy and use them. But the whole idea of our world was somehow different when someone tried to assassinate

an ex-President and Presidential candidate. As a graduate student in history, during the 70's, I look for more. During the time I was watching TV trying to learn all I could, who was the shooter? Where was he or she? Was it a lone wolf or would more shots ring out? No one was sure and now after some time has gone, by you probably know more than I did

when I wrote this article.

I then identified with

the victims in the crowd and their families. Are they watching TV like me and hoping and praying it was no one they knew and those who were with their loved ones that fell? As an administrator for many years, I identified with those in charge trying to protect as many as they could. I was proud of that old wounded victim who worried about his shoes and then raised his fist so they knew that he was okay. Like that football player being taken off the field on a stretcher and giving a thumbs up to the people.

A little later as they

settled down and most were sure there was not a second shooter, I realized it was not a matter of who I favored as a candidate. I was proud of these people who jumped on others before they had no confirmation that there were no other shooters. noticed how local police seemed to come out of nowhere and help people in the crowd.

Those in my generation remember JFK, RFK, King and Reagan. But the one I most remember and was most shocked was when they shot Pope John Paul II. I pray my children will never have to live through events like this. We have, as a people, lived through Pearl Harbor and 9/11, and we have come back stronger for it. If you and your family did not, I hope you can trust and have empathy for all involved. You might live 500 miles away, and some people will continue to affect them forever. Help your neighbors when you can. God Bless America.

National SkillsUSA Workforce Competition

Urge Reading Of Property Tax Bill

Cook County Treasurer Maria Pappas urges taxpayers to read their property tax bills to better understand record-high that have increases impacted homeowners, especially in the south and south-

in the south and south-west suburbs.

Tax bills are posted online at cookcountytrea-surer.com to view, down-load and pay. Bills were mailed July 2nd to own-ers of nearly 1.8 million parcels. The due date is Thursday, Aug. 1st.

The redesigned bills show the amount of taxes

show the amount of taxes owed for 2023, how much changed from 2022 and how much is paid to each tax body.

Pappas explained that this year's 19.9% increase in median homeowner tax bills in the south and southwest suburbs were the result of increases in the amount of taxes requested by schools, municipalities and a shift in tax burden from businesses to homeowners from the reassessment process.

The online version of "Where Your Money "Where Your Money Goes" allows taxpayers to click links for each taxing body. Visitors who enter an address or Property Index Number can search websites for school districts and other taxing bodies to research levies, budgets and other financial information.

The websitecookcountytreasurer.com also offers links to browse all financial reports filed by units of government.

Taxpayers can use the information to contact representatives of taxing bodies with questions and to learn when budget hearings and other public meetings are

held.
To help homeowners burdened by high property tax bills, Pappas led a campaign to reduce the interest rate charged for late taxes by half, from 18% to 9% per year. Property owners who do not pay their taxes in full by the due date are charged interest of 0.75% per month instead of 1.5%. Those unable to pay in full may make partial payments.

There is no fee to pay bills at cookcountytreasurer.com from bank accounts. There is a 2.1% processing fee for those who pay with a credit card. Enter an address and Property Index Number, and a photo of the property should appear.





State Celebrates Cannabis Sales

Governor JB Pritzker announced that Illinois reached \$1 billion in cannabis retail sales on July 1st. This includes more than \$850 million in adult use cannabis sales and almost \$150 million in medical cannabis sales.

This milestone was achieved nearly two weeks faster in 2024 compared to 2023, when the \$1 billion sales mark was not reached until July 10. Fiscal Year 2024 saw total cannabis sales exceed \$2 billion, which represents an increase from Fiscal Year 2023 (\$1.9 billion) and Fiscal Year 2022

(\$1.8 billion). Illinois made 81% of the total ofpurchases value through the first six months of 2024, while out-of-state consumers made 19%. The value of the product sold was 49% cannabis flower, 32% vape, and 22% edibles (along with liquid edibles

at 1.1.%). Tax revenue collected from cannabis sales has led to more than \$244 million in R3 Grants for economic development violence prevention, and

youth development.
