fund the planting of 20 trees for the next three years for a total of 60 additional cherry blossom trees at the grove. This collection of trees is part of the 250,000 tree canopy that is managed by the Chicago Park District. The citywide urban forest helps provide shade to keep park visitors cool in the summer, absorbs stormwater, reduces flooding and beautifies reduces neighborhoods.

In 2013, the first batch of trees were installed at Jackson Park to commemorate the 120th anniversary of the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition, and another 50 trees were added in the three years to follow by the JCCC in honor of their 50th anniversary and the relationship Chicago between and Japan.

In the fall of 2022, the Park District planted an additional 34 cherry blossom trees bordering the Museum of Science and Industry steps to bring the total to 190.

Jackson Park visitors

will see the newly planted cherry blossom trees on the Wooded Island around the Japanese Garden, and near the Columbia Basin, 6401 S. Stony Island ave., east side of Cornell Ave., just south of Museum of Science and Industry.

Visitors will also enjoy walking over the newly restored Moon Bridge. In November 2023, the Park District entered into a professional agreement with a specialty contractor trained in Japanese woodworking and bridge building. The gorgeous waterfall inside the Japanese Garden is on for the season, and offers a spectacular view as water streams down rocks into the koi filled pond where blue heron birds are known to stop

In partnership with cultural partners, the Park District will host a variety of events inspired in the Japanese culture.

The Honor is awarded to officers who have been killed or seriously injured in the line of duty, or who have displayed exception-

al bravery.
On October 7, 2023
Chicago Police officers
Reynol Cuéllar De La Cruz, Maximo Mora and Julio Zavala were riding together in a squad car, responding to a call of a "person shot" and a fleeing suspect vehicle. As the officers' squad car approached the suspect's vehicle, the suspect swerved into the squad car, striking it head-on. All three officers suffered extensive injuries that required lengthy recoveries. Assisting officers were able to take all the suspects into custody and recover multiple firearms

Other honorees were: 7 officers from Belvidere, 2 from State Police and 1 from Lake County.



Illinois is the epicenter of a rare double cicada brood emergence this summer, and IDNR wants to commemorate the occasion with a public art show in Conservation World during the 2024 Illinois State Fair, Aug. 8th-18th. Anyone can participate. There will be a junior exhibit for youth 17 and younger, and an adult show for everyone 18 and older. Deadline to enter is Sunday, June

16th.
"There's a tremendous amount of interest in cicadas this year in Illinois. They're fascination in the state of the s ing insects, and I'm excited to see what artists from all over Illinois come up with," said IDNR Director Natalie Phelps Finnie. "Artists can be as serious or as silly as they want with this challenge. Realistic, creative, wacky, whimsical, or kitsch – we're here for it all. We think the cicadas would want it that way.'

Original artwork should depict the artist's best interpretation of a cicada or a brood. No AIgenerated artwork will be Acceptable accepted.

materials and mediums include paper, canvas, or photography, charcoal, pencil, colored pencil, markers, alcohol markers, ink, acrylic paint, oil paint, oil pastels, or

watercolor paint. Artwork should be no larger than 18 x 24 inches. Entries will be accepted digitally at first. Complete the entry form online at https://dnr.illinois.gov/cicada-art-contest.html and upload a clear, well-lit, digital photo of the artwork.

Entries will be reviewed by panelists from IDNR and the Illinois State Museum. Finalists will be selected to have their work displayed during the fair. Finalists will be contacted and asked to submit their original artwork by mailing it to IDNR headquarters in Springfield.

Fairgoers will have an opportunity to vote for their favorite cicada artwork from their phones during the fair. The winning People's Choice entry will win a prize from IDNR.

#### Seek Funding For Revoked FOID Cards

Nearly three out of every four revoked FOID card holders have not accounted for their firearms or returned their FOID cards, according to a new report compiled by the Cook County Sheriff's Of-

Of the more than 39,000 people in Cook County who have their Firearm Owner's Identification card revoked, 68% (about 27,000) have not accounted for their guns or turned in their FOID cards as required by law. Statewide data is even more disturbing. Of the approximate 112,000 revoked FOID cardholders, 74% (about 84,000) are not compliant.

In Cook County, between April 1, 2022, and December 30, 2023, the backlog of 24,000 non-compliant FOID card holders increased to more than 27.000. Statewide, the backlog of non-compli-ant revoked FOID card holders increased by more than 1,000 from October 2023 through February 2024

Among the most common reasons for FOID revocations are felony convictions. mental

health concerns, and orders of protection. In 2013, Sheriff Dart created a Gun Team to retrieve FOID cards and guns. As a result, there is no backlog of cases in unincorporated Cook County or Ford Heights where the Sheriff's Office patrols. To date, the team has worked nearly 9,200 revoked FOID cases, resulting in the recovery of more than 4,050 revoked FOID cards and more than 1,300 guns, as well as the safe transfer of more than 3,000 firearms.

A few jurisdictions in Cook County have been able to stay on top of the growing FOID revocations, but the vast majority have no personnel to do this work. Unless there is an infusion of state money, communities will never be able to catch up. Sheriff Dart called on

lawmakers to pass HB 5442, that would increase the Firearm Transfer Inquiry Program fee to \$10. FTIP is operated by the Illinois State Police and uses firearm dealers to perform background checks on potential buyers. The \$\bar{2}\$ fee has not changed since 1992, and the increase would provide an additional esti-

This June, a new exhibit, Akito Tsuda: Pilsen Days will open on the 9th floor of the Harold Washington Library Center, 400 S. State st. Featuring work by Japanese photographer Akito Tsuda, Pilsen Days highlights the unique spirit and daily life of the neighborhood in the 1990s.

Tsuda arrived from Japan in 1988 at the age of 21 and enrolled at Columbia College Chicago in 1990. On a class photography assignment, he encountered Pilsen, a primarily Mexican American neighborhood and found himself readily accepted. Despite knowing only some English and no Spanish, he photographed over 500 striking images over the next four years.

After graduation, he returned to Japan in 1994 and kept his Pilsen images in storage for 20

In 2014, wanting to reconnect with the people of Pilsen, selected images were posted on Facebook and Instagram, where the positive response was immediate. Excited viewers identified family members, friends and other subjects of the photos and shared stories about the experience of being photographed as well as the lives of the people in the

Through the support of several local community centers and cultural institutions, Tsuda has traveled back to Chicago multiple times to meet with residents and share his work. State law requires teen drivers and a parent or guardian to visit a DMV in person to complete testing and identity verification prior to receiving their first driver's license.

Parents and teens can call (800) 252-8980 to schedule an appointment at any of the 12 DMV lo-

cations.

The designated teen service hours will make an additional 1,000 appointments per week available to accommodate the nearly 9,000 current permit holders who become eligible for a license this summer. The Teen DMVs will also free up appointments during the week for those needing in-

person visits. Teen service hours will be offered at the following locations: Addison, Aurora, Bethalto, Belvidere, Bridgeview, Chicago West, Des Plaines; Elgin, Joliet, Lake Zurich, Plano
