

Crisis Prevention & Response Unit

Ahead of Memorial Day Weekend, Governor JB Pritzker and the Illinois Department of Human Services are launching a Citywide Crisis Prevention & Response Unit, a mobile team that is designed to prevent violence and address conflict and crises in the City of Chicago. 30+ trained neighborhood "Peace-keepers" and street outreach partners will provide assistance in de-escalation, conflict resolution, and crisis support.

by the Office of Firearm Violence Prevention. Young residents from high-risk neighborhoods are empowered as Peacekeepers who receive a stipend and conflict de-escalation training. The Reimagine Public Safety Act funds violence prevention services in Chicago's most vulnerable neighborhoods and other communities with a high rate of gun violence. In 2022, Governor Pritzker invested into violence prevention services, including summer job support for youth, mental health services, and conflict resolution ambassadors.

Chicago Public Schools CEO Pedro Martinez and City Colleges of Chicago Chancellor Juan Salgado recognized approximately 5,000 Class of 2023 graduates who earned nearly 40,000 total college credits from while still in high school, saving an estimated \$5.8 million in projected college tuition costs. More than 600 seniors from 69 CPS high schools received a ceremonial blue cord, for earning 15 or more college credits during their junior and senior years, the equivalent of one semester in college. Another 110 students earned a gold cord for attaining 30 credits or more. 53 graduating students who earned an associate degree in addition to their high school diploma received a plaque. CPS and CCC began offering early college courses, also called dual credit or dual enrollment, more than a decade ago and have continued expanding these opportunities throughout the city while forming a unique partnership known as The Chicago Roadmap. The initiative provides access to high-quality programs, advising and supports, career exploration and preparedness in an effort to equitably increase student outcomes in college enrollment, college degree attainment, and employment. In total, CPS scholars earned 100 or more credits at 21 high schools and students earned high school and college graduate milestones at 49 schools. Early college courses are advanced courses and can enhance a student's overall high school GPA. Credits can be transferred to many colleges, but policies vary by school. Dual credit courses are taught by qualified CPS teachers at high school campuses. CCC works with individual high school teachers to ensure lessons meet the same standards as courses taken at a CCC campus. Dual enrollment courses are taught at City Colleges of Chicago by CCC faculty.
