CPS Celebrates **Dual Credit Grads**

Chicago Public Schools CEO Pedro Martinez and City Colleges of Chicago Chancellor Juan Salgado recognized approximately 5,000 Class of 2023 graduates who earned nearly 40,000 total college credits from while still in high school, saving an estimated \$5.8 million in procollege tuition jected

More than 600 seniors

from 69 CPS high schools received a ceremonial blue cord, for earning 15 or more college credits during their junior and senior years, the equivalent of one semester in col lege. Another 110 students earned a gold cord for attaining 30 credits or more. 53 graduating students who earned an associate degree in addition to their high school diploma received

plaque.
CPS and CCC began
offering early college
courses, also called dual credit or dual enrollment, more than a decade ago and have continued expanding these opportunities throughout the city while forming a unique

partnership known as The Chicago Roadmap. The initiative provides access to high-quality programs, advising and supports, career exploration and preparedness in an effort to equitably increase student outcomes in college enrollment, college degree attainment, and employ-

In total, CPS scholars earned 100 or more credits at 21 high schools and students earned high school and college graduate milestones at 49 schools.

Early college courses are advanced courses and can enhance a student's overall high school GPA. Credits can be transferred to many colleges, but policies vary by school. Dual credit courses are taught by qualified CPS teachers at high school campuses. CCC works with individual high school teachers to ensure lessons meet the same standards as courses taken at a CCC campus. Dual enrollment courses are taught at City Colleges of Chicago by CCC faculty.

New Initiative For Homeless

The Department of Family and Support Services; and All Chicago Homelessness History announced a partnership with the White House and U.S. Interagency Council on Homelessness to participate in ALL INside, an initiative to address unsheltered homelessness.

The City will partner with USICH and its 19 federal member agencies for up to two years to strengthen and accelerate local efforts to move unsheltered people off the streets and into homes.

Support includes: Embedding a federal official in each community to accelerate driven strategies and enact system-level changes to reduce unsheltered homelessness

Deploying teams across the federal government to identify opportunities for regulatory relief and flexibilities, navigate federal funding streams, and facilitate a peer learning network; and Convening philanthropy, the private sector, and other communities to identify opportunities for

follow-on support. The City of Chicago, identified the following points as key areas of need. A priority on pathways to housing for residents returning from jails and prisons and residents with arrest or conviction records, including a systematic review of eligibility and exclusions.
