#### A-G Raoul Issues **Phone Scam Alert**

Attorney General Kwame Raoul urges residents to be wary of scammers who use unsolicited email or text messages to trick consumers into sharing personal and financial information. Unsolicited messages

may be email phishing or may be email phishing or text message smishing scams. Phishing is when scammers send a decep-tive email to trick Internet users into revealing personal or confidential information. Smishing, or Short Message Service phishing, is when scammers send a deceptive text message to trick cell phone users in the same way. Phishing and smishing messages may contain links to harmful software that could enable scammers to steal information from your phone or computer. Consumers should not click any links in an unsolicited email or text

and delete the message immediately.

Those who have replied to smishing texts or clicked on links provided in such texts and emails can reduce the risk of identity theft by signing up for free bank or credit card transaction alerts, placing a fraud alert with one of the three credit reporting agencies, or placing a freeze on their credit

#### **County Issues Notice To MWO**

The Cook County Commission on Human Rights issued a notice to employees regarding the Minimum Wage Ordi-

Effective July 1st, the Cook County minimum wage will increase to \$13.70 for non-tipped workers and \$8.00 for tipped employees.

Each year the minimum wage increases according to a formula set by the Ordinance. The MWO applies to hourly, salaried, and tipped employees over the age of 18, working in Cook County.

Cook County's minimum wage is based on the greatest rate among the Federal minimum wage, Illinois State minimum wage, or on the County's calculation using the Consumer Price Index.

## Seek Volunteers For Heat Watch

The City of Chicago kicked off the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration 2023 Heat Watch Campaign to build a team of community scientists to measure heat across communities this

Heat Watch 2023 is a community heat-mapping project that brings to-gether local volunteers, public and private organizations, universities, and non-profit organizations to co-produce high-resolution heat maps and genercreative collaborative solutions for extreme heat in Chicago.

The Chicago Department of Public Health will train volunteer resident scientists on one of the hottest and clearest days of the year to drive with heat sensors on their cars in the morning, midday, and evening on routes informed by the community. This information will be analyzed to improve Chicago's heat safety strategies. Factors like humidity,

tree coverage, air flow, heavy traffic, and the density of buildings and concrete all contribute to how intense the heat feels, creating what is known as an urban heat island effect. The City remains committed to addressing the impacts of extreme heat through policies like the 2022 Cooling Ordinance which protects residents by requiring indoor cooling in certain buildings. The Our Roots Chicago program also addresses heat safety through nature-based solutions and


