DREAM Act Signed Into Law

State Rep. Edward (D-Chicago) Acevedo joined his colleagues in the Latino caucus and Governor Pat Quinn for the signing of the Illinois DREAM Act at Benito Juarez High School on Aug. 1st.
The Act allows stu-

dents who are undocumented immigrants to qualify for a privatelyfunded scholarship program and to be able to participate in state-sponsored college savings program. It would also create the DREAM Commission to collect private donations for the scholarship fund.
