Promote Reading To Children 0-5

The Chicago Public Library has launched the "Take 20, Read Plenty" public awareness campaign to promote the importance of reading 20 minutes a day to children ages 0-5.

Research indicates that children are equipped with 100 billion neurons at birth, but pathways between the neurons are not yet established. Reading to children aids in strengthening those connections.

Moreover, the number of words a child is exposed to between the ages of zero and three are strong predictors of educational success and eventual economic stability.

Seminal research shows there is a thirty

million word gap between families of lower and higher socioeconomic statuses, so children living in poverty tend to fall behind faster in their development and in school. Children need to hear at least 1,000 stories read aloud before they can learn to read themselves.

Each CPL location will have a reading nook in order to model the practice of reading aloud and to provide an atmosphere conducive to reading aloud.
