## 34th Anniversary Of '79 Papal Visit

The 34th annual Mass commemorating the anniversary of Pope John Paul II's visit to Five Holy Martyrs Parish will take place on Sunday, Oct. 6th. Weather permitting, this bi-lingual English - Polish Mass will be celebrated at the Papal Altar in the Parish parking lot, 44th and Richmond at 11 a.m.

The main celebrant and homilist will be Rev. Michal Skiba, S.Ch., a religious order priest from the Society of Christ.

The Pope John Paul II Centrum Committee has raised over \$58,000 and continues raising funds to renovate this altar to make it a permanent fixture.

On Sept. 24th, 2011, Five Holy Martyrs Parish received a relic of Blessed John Paul II from his Eminence, Stanislaw Cardinal Dziwisz, the Archbishop of Krakow, Poland and former personal secretary to Pope John Paul II.

The relic is a drop of Blessed Pope John Paul II's blood on a cloth protected by a lunula, a small, round glass encasement. The lunula has been mounted into a reliquary, a vessel in which a relic is held and exposed.

Since receiving this relic, the parish has begun a new tradition on the first Sunday of the month by sharing interesting facts, stories, and poems about him in a bulletin insert; by offering up petitions to God through his intercession and venerating his relic at the 9 a.m. English and 11 a.m. Polish Masses; reciting



**POPE JOHN PAUL II** the prayer for his canonization as a community of believers; and by receiving a special blessing with the relic at the end of Mass.

After these two Masses, parishioners and friends are invited to gather in the Bishop Abramowicz Parish Hall for cake, coffee, and fellowship. All parish, cultural and neighborhood organizations are invited to attend this Mass on Oct. 6th and walk in the entrance procession.

## Houlihan Completes Army ROTC Course

Army Cadet Matthew R. Houlihan has graduated from the Army ROTC Leader's Training Course at Fort Knox, Ky.

The four-week course is a leadership internship for cadets that can lead to the ultimate goal of becoming an Army officer. ## Brookfield Zoo Closes Baboon Island

Baboon Island, an iconic exhibit at Brookfield Zoo has been closed. Since the late 1960s, nearly 150 Guinea baboons have been born at the zoo. Over the years, a variety of other species shared the habitat including aoudad antelope (wild sheep), meerkats, rock hyrax, monitor and rainbow lizards and African porcupines.

Originally called Monkey Island, the exhibit was first home to a colony of Rhesus monkeys in the mid-1930s. Some young Malay bears also shared the exhibit. In 1938, the zoo received Guinea baboons and generations of families have observed many fascinating interactions and

behaviors in these highly social animals, including grooming, playing, infant development, male competition for females, mating, and vocalizing.

The troop was the subject of many studies by students, scientists, and field researchers, and served as a formal educational resource used to teach behavioral observation techniques and primate behavior to many school classes.

During recent physical exams, veterinary staff made the decision to euthanize its three Guinea baboons, which ranged in age from 22 to 27, due to quality-of-life concerns.

The existing exhibit is scheduled to be demolished sometime in 2014.

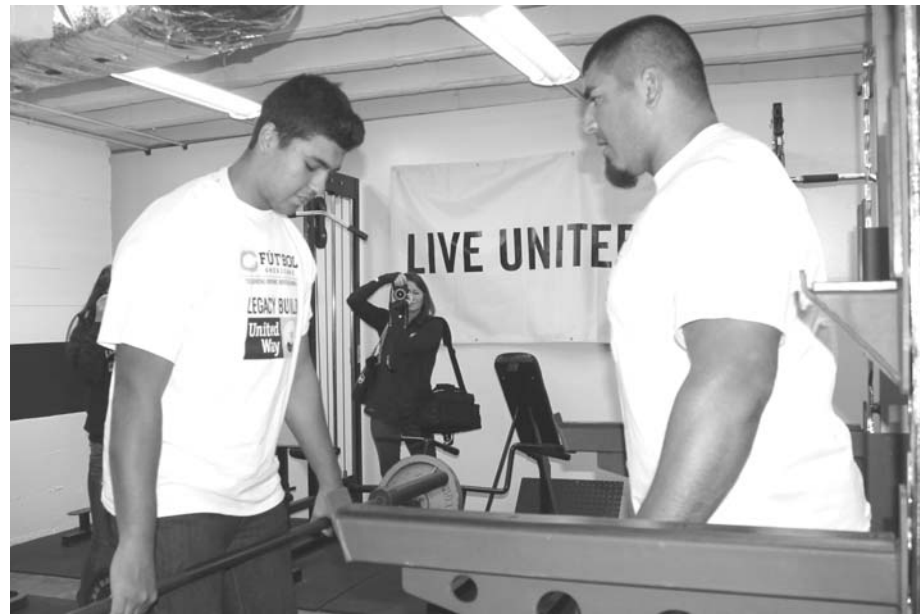
## Renovation For Kelly Fitness Center

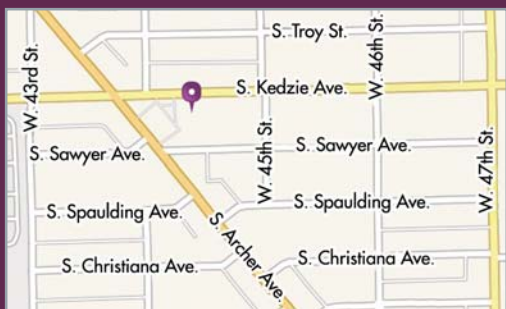
