

Our Schools - Another View

I recently had a pleasant encounter with high school students from Louisiana. These students were from several high schools that are members of Advanced Placement classes and the trip was part of their college credit. They came to Chicago for a conference. They also visited St. Louis and on their trip home were going to visit Memphis. These students were all expecting to be education majors. They then visited myself and three other retired educators. Having returned from their conference, they had many questions about CPS and the Archdiocese schools. They expressed a sincere desire to try and understand how one non-elected school board could hope to deal with 600 unique schools. These students were from very different schools and together they were as diverse socially, economically and every other way you can think of. This made them similar to the Chicago schools. They

had problems understanding how children who speak a language other than English at home are allowed to take classes for credit in that language when many schools admit their students compete for class rank.

These students informed us that it was not considered poor or degrading for students to choose to attend trade schools and not four year universities. There seemed to be no consideration that this is inferior. They said that they have not seen this at their conference. It appears students do not attend these schools, except as a last resort, where in Louisiana, many consider becoming a plumber or electrician at least equal to the jobs you get with four years of college.

It was great to hear they really were considering these items. They asked about the political agendas of teachers noting that teachers could be fired back home for encouraging students to skip school to attend marches, etc. What a novel idea from 17-year-olds.

Several expressed the shock at the cost of tuition at some Catholic high schools. They seemed to have problems making sense of paying more for tuition to high school than a State University. Their discussion included that it was worth it if the parents and children were very devout or their local public school was that bad.

It is great to hear these 17-year-olds be concerned with the education field that they hope to enter in the near future. Sadly, I never did. But I hope that more of our future educators really think about all that it entails.

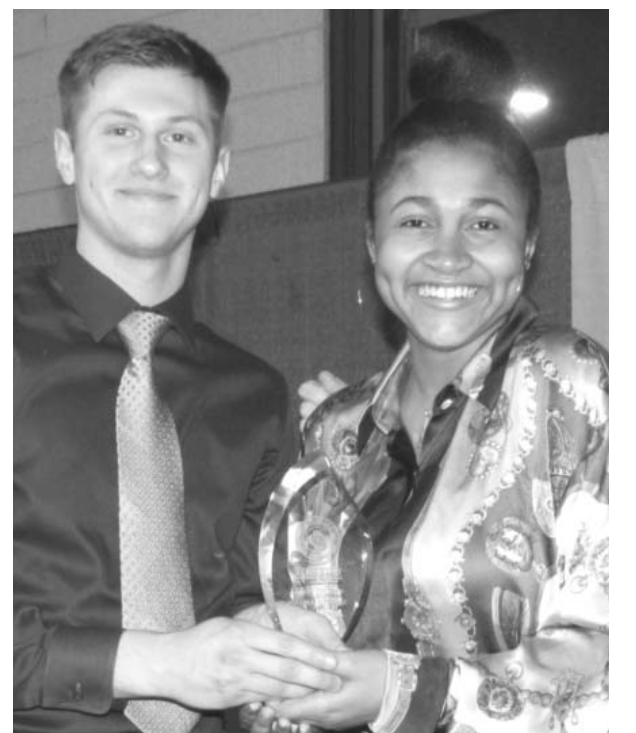

Antelope Birth At Brookfield Zoo

The Chicago Zoological Society, which manages Brookfield Zoo announces the birth of a Kirk's dik-dik, one of the world's smallest antelope species on June 4th, weighing about 1.5 pounds.

Currently, the calf is given a milk bottle four to five times a day as well as chopped hay. He will soon

be introduced to new diet items such as grain and produce. The month-old calf has access to an outdoor habitat prior to the zoo opening.

Guests can see an adult pair during regular zoo hours. Once full grown, he will weigh approximately 12 to 14 pounds and measure 14 to 16 inches tall at the shoulder.

Dik-diks are herbivorous mammals that primarily eat foliage, shoots and berries, which is where they consume their water. They can live in both dense forests and open plains and are found throughout Africa. There are 33 dik-dik antelopes in 15 accredited North American zoos.

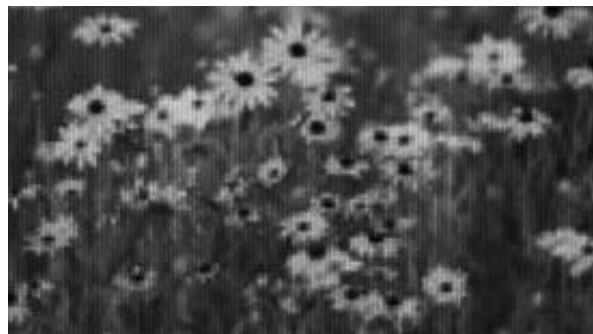
