## Property Tax Savings For U.S. Veterans

Cook County Assessor Fritz Kaegi reminds veterans that they may be eligible for property tax-saving exemptions that reduce their tax bills.

Veterans who believe they may have been eligible for a past exemption can file for a Certificate of Error dating back to 2019.

The Veterans with Disabilities Exemption reduces the equalized assessed value on the primary residence, very likely lowering the tax bill. Veterans who are 70% or more disabled receive an EAV reduction of \$250,000.

Veterans must renew annually, except for those who are rated 100% disabled.

The Returning Veterans Exemption is for veterans returning from active duty in an armed conflict. They are eligible to receive a \$5,000 reduction in the equalized assessed value of their property only for each taxable year in which they return and the year after.
