



Department of Education

The efforts to make the Federal government less cumbersome and more efficient has now reached the point of closing the Department of Education. I will attempt to make this discussion a little more understandable with no effort to explain all the arguments. There are extensive writings you can find on the internet if that interests you.

The arguments are basically on party lines. In general, the Republicans want it closed. The moderates don't seem to care. The anti-Trump people want it to remain open. As I brought up the subject, most of the people I talked with basically said it does not affect my family.

The Department has been a point of contention since President Carter signed the bill creating it in 1980. Despite what you may hear, the department was not part of the Constitution. There are an estimated 4,200 employed in the department. The proponents of its closing contend that many of the necessary programs can be handled by the Departments that previously had the responsibilities. These departments include Justice, Housing and Urban Development, and

Agriculture with assurances that the educational grants program will not be closed.

In 1980, the National Education Association and the American Federation of Teachers were on opposite sides on this issue. The arguments seem to center on student scores. However, in the years since its inception, scores have remained flat and even gone down, especially when compared to the scores in other nations.

I served on many committees and programs founded by the department. I met many people working for the department who were capable and hard working, doing what they were assigned. Over the years, I talked with other administrators. We all had a similar issue. The Feds do not hand out money without strings attached and those strings meant a lot of time and costs by the local systems. Some believe the total budget could be better spent locally. On the other hand, some believe a centralized effort is more effective.

A stat I heard on WLS AM radio is that of all the people in the United States paid for by funds listed as educational, only 47% of the personnel being paid with these funds were teachers and teacher aides. These stats seem to be surprising that the other 53% pay for administrators, janitors, cooks, etc.

The situation may be hard to comprehend, but one thing you should think of is that it depends on your voting district. You have no choice as our elected officials have made up their minds. Your only choice is to be cognizant of their votes and if you disagree with their vote, keep that in mind at the next election.

Disparities In Referendum Turnout

In a first of its kind analysis, the Cook County Treasurer's Office found that voters from majority-white communities are more likely to vote and determine the outcome of critical property tax-related referendums. The same is true for voters who own their homes or who earn more than the median household income for Cook County.

Findings from the 2024 presidential election year include: Wealthier residents are more likely to vote. In the county's wealthiest taxing districts, average turnout topped 60% but was only 34% in districts where median household income fell below the county median of \$81,797;

White residents are more likely to vote. On average, turnout in majority-white districts was more than 20 percentage points higher than in Black, Latino and majority-minority districts;

Homeowners are more likely to vote. In taxing districts where 80% or more of residents own their homes, average turnout exceeded 55%. Turnout, on average, was just 30% in districts where over 20% of residents rent.

Two March 2024 primary referendums — one in a low-income south suburb and the other in a high-income North Shore suburb — highlight these voting trends.

Robbin's Park District lies in a majority-Black south suburban area where the median household income is \$38,000, and less than 73% of residents own their homes. In the district's primary referendum, only 14% of voters weighed in — one of the lowest turnouts in the primary.

In Kenilworth, a majority-white North Shore suburb where the median household income is higher than \$250,000, and more than 97% of residents own their own homes — the participation rate was more than double, with over 33% of voters turning out for a \$2.5 million bond issuance.

The Treasurer's analysis also shows that residents across the county in 2024 tended to skip voting when given the chance to decide whether to increase their own property taxes. A majority of voters turned out for property tax-related referendums in less than half of cases. This perpetuates a pattern of frequently leaving crucial pocketbook decisions up to a tiny segment of voters.

The analysis of the 35 referendums in 2024 found:

Overall average property tax-related referen-



dum turnout increased slightly, to 45.9% from 43%, from the last presidential election year;

For the March primary election, average turnout was only 20.9%;

For the November general election, average turnout increased to 62.6%.

Drop-off voters, who go to the polls but skip the referendum questions farther down the ballot, further suppressed overall participation. During the primary, the median drop-off rate was 3% and increased to 8.7% in the general election — for an overall median drop-off rate of 6.2%.

Those who did weigh in approved 26, or 74%, of the referendums on ballots in 2024. The approved referendums gave cities, villages, schools, park districts and other local governments authority to:

Proceed with 14 bond issuances that created \$563 million in new debt;

Exceed state caps on tax levy increases by more than \$4.5 million across three taxing districts;

Establish two mental health service programs in Chicago and a new park district in University Park; Dissolve one taxing district;

Adopt home rule powers — which give municipal officials greater power to impose new or higher taxes — in three suburbs.

Voters will again have a say on referendums in the upcoming April 1, 2025 consolidated election. They will be asked to decide whether to raise new taxes and increase government debt by hundreds of millions of dollars. These races, in which people vote solely on local issues, tend to have poor overall turnout.

New Parking Ordinance For Unregistered Vehicles

After months of advocacy and leadership, 14th Ward Alderwoman Jeylú B. Gutiérrez sponsored and successfully passed SO2024-0010137 during the Feb. 19th council meeting to address the problem of abandoned and unregistered vehicles. The curbstone ordinance took into effect March 22nd and allow the city to ticket and tow unregistered vehicles, closing long-standing

loopholes that allowed bad actors to avoid penalties.

Many blocks in the 14th Ward are always at full capacity, leaving residents with limited parking options. The previous ordinance allowed abandoned vehicles to remain indefinitely by being moved a few inches to reset the seven-day tow period. Illegal car sellers used public streets as unauthorized sales lots, leaving unregistered vehicles parked for extended periods. These vehicles blocked critical city services, including street cleaning, tree trimming, and snow removal. The inability to enforce vehicle registration made it difficult to identify stolen cars.

Take Advantage of Tax Credits

The Illinois Department of Revenue encourages eligible Illinoisans to take advantage of savings offered by tax credits when filing their 2024 income tax returns.

The Illinois Earned Income Tax Credit is a benefit for working people with low to moderate income. Taxpayers must file an Illinois income tax return, even if they do not owe any tax and are not required to file and: have worked and earned income under \$66,819 (income amount is dependent upon filing status and number of qualifying children), have investment income below

\$11,600, have a valid Social Security number (SSN) or IRS-issued Individual Taxpayer Identification Number by the due date of the 2024 return (including extensions), are at least age 18 by the end of 2024. Note: This includes taxpayers ages 18-24 and 65 and older without a qualifying child, are a U.S. citizen or a resident alien all year.

Taxpayers eligible for the federal EITC automatically qualify for the Illinois EITC.

The Illinois Child Tax Credit is a new tax credit for the 2024 tax year for taxpayers who qualify for the Illinois EITC and have at least one child that is their dependent and under the age of 12 years old. The credit is calculated this year as 20% of the Illinois EITC. For tax year 2025, the Child Tax Credit will increase to 40% of the Illinois EITC.
